DELTA BETA'S "FRAT CAR"



An unexpected guest appeared at the recent Province Seven Convention in Oklahoma City, and it turned out to be an added attraction to convention-goers. The item of interest was the 1939 Buick Special "Frat Car" belong to Delta Beta Chapter at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Weatherford, Ok.

The history of the car begins in 1970 when Lawrence Forbes donated the car to Delta Beta. The car, known only as the "Frat Car" received a new coat of paint and normal maintenance during the next two years. In 1972, the transmission failed and the car was idle for the next two years due to a lack of parts and an experienced mechanic. In 1974, Delta Beta member Billy Welch and father, Nelson Welch hauled the car to Levelland, Texas where almost everything except the engine was rebuilt or reconditioned. (The original engine is still in the car and in good running shape.) A new transmission was improvised from that of a '55 Buick and the old 16-inch wheels were replaced with 15-inch wheels.

Looking at the title, we see that the original owner paid \$700.00 for the car in 1939, which included a straight 8 cylinder engine, three speed shift on the column, automatic choke, clock, spare tire, trip-set odometer, and locking steering wheel. Finances required for operation of the car in 1976 include \$6.00 for the current "Bicentennial" license and over \$200.00 for insurance.

The "Frat Car" is driven in the annual homecoming parade, to the spring picnic and most recently to the Province Seven Convention. Each semester, the pledges wash and wax the car as a pledge project. The car is available for local use by any member of Delta Beta in good standing with the Fraternity. A flat rate of 15 cents per mile is charged the driver which goes to pay for operating expenses, maintenance and insurance. Randy Patterson, our local ace mechanic keeps the car tuned up and well greased.

Delta Beta is proud of our "Frat Car" and profits from its uniqueness. We feel that a similarity exists between our car and pharmacy fraternities when you say that "the oldest is the best."

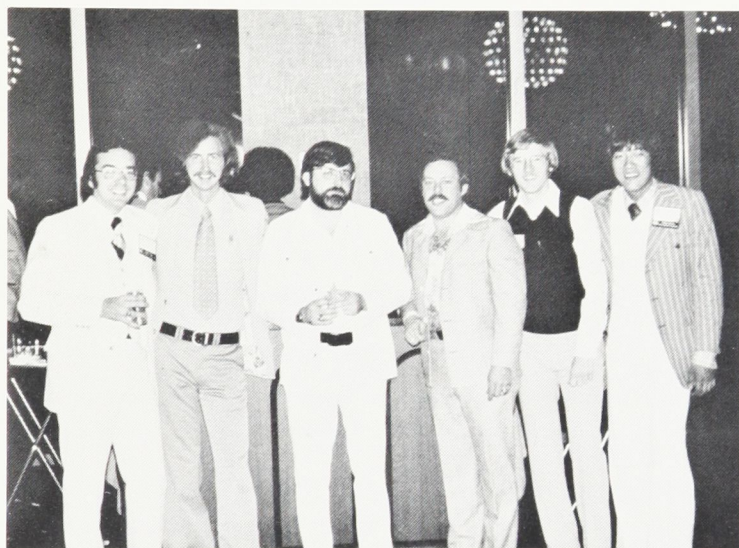

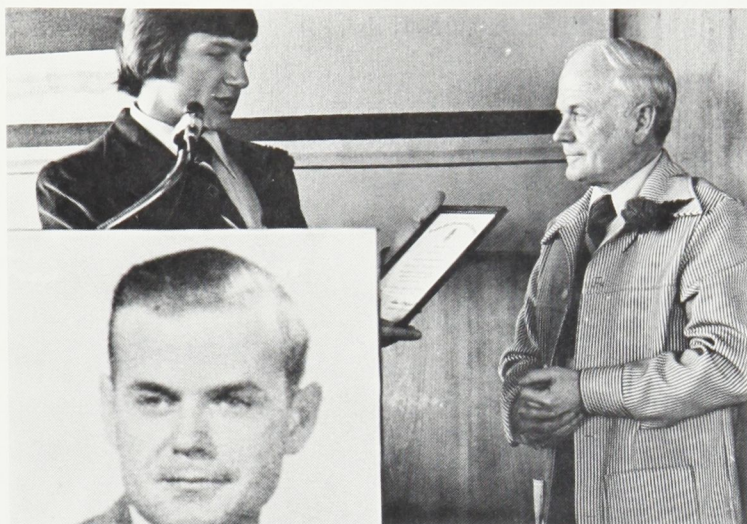

"It's not often that a Dean remains for ten years, and it's not often that the faculty still cares for him if he is there for ten years," stated University President, C. Peter Magrath, at the Testimonial Reception and Roast held for College of Pharmacy Dean Lawrence C. (Larry) Weaver on April 30, 1976, at the University Campus Club. The Event was sponsored by Epsilon Chapter of Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity.

John A. Frank, Jr.

Brother Frank was born on February 15, 1906 in Turtle Creek, Pennsylvania. He was born into a family of pharmacists—father, three uncles, one aunt, and two uncles-in-law were pharmacists. About the turn of the century, the Frank family has established the Frank Brothers Drug Company which consisted of seven drug stores and a laboratory in the eastern suburban towns of Pittsburgh. All his immediate family, a sister and two brothers all went into pharmacy but then branched into other professions. Brother Frank graduated from the University of Pittsburgh with a Ph.G. in 1926. He returned to college at St. Joseph's College in Philadelphia and received a B.S. degree in chemistry in 1930.

"I was initiated into the Beta Kappa Chapter at the University of Pittsburgh in early 1925. At that time Kappa Psi consisted of both medical and pharmaceutical professions. But the following year Kappa Psi became the Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity. We worked very hard those two years to interest the best men in the pharmacy school to choose Kappa Psi and we were very successful."

PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

"In 1927, I received my Registered Pharmacist from the state of Pennsylvania and in 1928 in the state of New Jersey. Then in 1930, four of us from St. Joseph's College faced with the Depression, took off for Los Angeles, California where I took a temporary license and went to work for Sontag Drug Company."

"In 1943, I went into the Army as Chief Pharmacist at a Station Hospital at Staten Island, N.Y. At that time I had a running battle with Dr. Robert Fischelis of the A.Ph.A. about the plight of the graduate pharmacist in the Army. There is an old adage in the Army "Don't Volunteer for Anything." We volunteered for everything. We made distilled water for the whole hospital, sterilizing solutions for the O.R., sterile ampules and vials, D.D.T. solutions, gave courses in pharmacy to wardmen and metric systems to nurses. But I finally saw my goal when Congress approved the Pharmacy Corp. in the Army."

In 1938, I took a position with the Upjohn Company in Kalamazoo, Michigan and was with them for 33 years with the exception of the two years in the Army. In 1971 I retired from Upjohn—but not quite. I am president of the Board of Health in Broomall, PA, a community of 27,000 people about 17 miles south of Philadelphia."

"I have always enjoyed my association with Kappa Psi and the pharmacy profession and fought many a battle for both. But now it is time to hand my cudgel over to younger men."

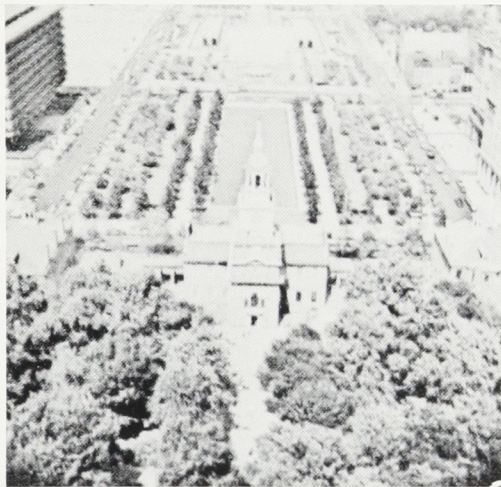
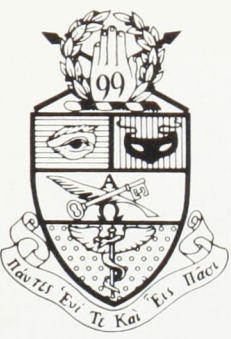

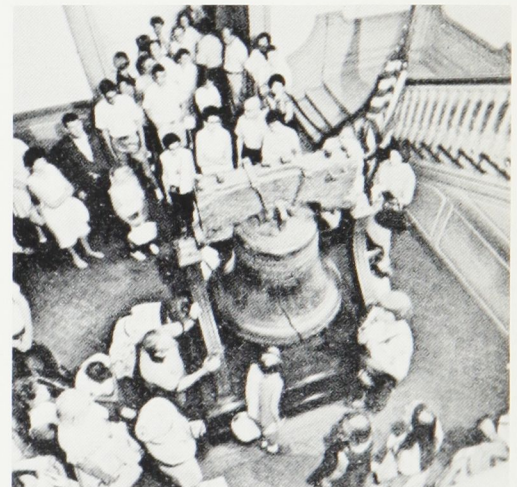
