
From the Grand Regent

Report to 44th Grand Council Convention

Just two short years ago I stood before you following the 43rd Grand Council Convention in a state of excitement, optimism and enthusiasm. I was thrilled with the challenge and opportunity to serve my fraternity in the highest office in Kappa Psi, the Grand Regent. By virtue of my previous tenure as Grand Vice Regent, I had some anticipation for the duties and responsibilities of the post. Certainly there was my own personal agenda for the fraternity, those functions, activities and needs which, in my opinion, required some expeditious attention. My address to the delegation assembled in Orlando was entitled "Preparing for the 21st Century". In that address I outlined activities, to which I was committed, and promised that I would urge the Fraternity to pursue same. Those activities included: planning, growth, development and the image of Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity. In spite of failing to accomplish everything that I had hoped might be achievable, I am proud to stand before you this day and report that the past two years may have been among the most significant in terms of growth and development, certainly in the recent history of Kappa Psi and perhaps for even more years in our past. I have a personal habit of setting lofty goals for myself and my co-workers. When one meets such goals the feeling of accomplishment is grand. But should one fail to achieve the goals in their totality, attaining a hardy proportion often can be extremely satisfying. Yes, in many respects I feel extremely satisfied with our accomplishments. No question, I wish we could have achieved more, but candidly, the capacity to achieve is much better defined once the planner and goal setter is on the inside, that is, in a position of knowledge and awareness of the true capacity of the institution.

Just what did we set out to do.

Planning: With the assistance of the Task Force on Strategic Planning, the Executive Committee, and Executive Director Robert Magarian, a procedure for strategic planning was established. Individualized data collection questionnaires were designed, pretested and distributed to each Collegiate Chapter, Grand Council Deputy, Graduate Chapter and College of Pharmacy Dean. In spite of a disappointing reply from both collegiate and graduate chapters, ample information was returned to provide the Executive Committee with a



vivid description of how the fraternity is perceived by the four publics listed above. I am pleased to report that the overall assessment of the Central Office and the National Officers was very favorable and supportive. Perhaps the need receiving the strongest response was that of exposure to the national officers in the form of chapter visitations and other functions and activities where national officers might be in attendance. There were a number on individual concerns expressed by chapters which will be more sufficiently discussed in our session later in the week when we will address the details of the planning activity. I am pleased to report that the Executive Committee is studying this information and will bring forth additional actions in this overall strategic planning process in the future.

Growth: This pledge was taken very seriously. It has been 25 years since the Frater**nity** installed two chapters in one year, and even longer since installing two chapters in the same month. But on April 23, 1988, officials of Kappa Psi including Executive Director Magarian, Grand Historian Ritualist Paul Heller, brothers of Beta Xi Chapter and myself, traveled to Buies Creek, North Carolina to initiate 46 pledges, install Delta Lambda Chapter and install the first chapter officers. Then one week later, April 30, 1988, Brothers Magarian, Heller, Collegiate Member at Large Jeff Lee, brothers of Beta Omicron Chapter including Grand Council Deputy

William Fassett and myself traveled to Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada to initiate 17 pledges and 1 faculty, install **Delta Mu Chapter** and install the first chapter officers. We were buoyed by the excitement, fraternal spirit and enthusiasm of our newest brothers and chapters in **Kappa Psi**. Hardy appreciation is extended to Brother Fred M. Cox, Grand Council Deputy, Delta Lambda and Brother James E. Axelson, **Grand Council Deputy, Delta Mu** for their efforts on behalf of the new chapters, the new initiates and the Fraternity.

Last fall, Brother Mike Steffens, an initiate of Beta Psi Chapter, transferred to the University of Illinois and with him brought the strong desire to rekindle the brotherhood of Kappa Psi in the dormant Chi Chapter. Brother Steffens' motivation and commitment to the Fraternity resulted in a sequence of events which brought about the reactivation of the Chapter on February 20, 1989. A number of individuals and chapters are deserving of recognition in this wonderful display of brotherhood and determination to make Kappa Psi the very best that it can be. They include brothers from Beta Psi, Beta Upsilon, Gamma Pi, St. Louis Graduate Chapter, Illinois Graduate Chapter, Brother John Russell, the Associate Dean for Student Affairs at the University of Illinois and Grand Vice Regent William R. Smith. I am pleased to report that Chi Chapter is fully reactivated and has an active membership of 20 brothers.

There remain a number of activities to be completed, I am proud to report that we are optimistic regarding several chapter reactivations as well as collegiate chapter and graduate chapter development in South Florida. A number of resources and efforts have already been invested which we believe will result in further expansion of our chapter base.

In addition to expansion and reactivation of chapters, a number of chapters are experiencing significant increases in the numbers of active brothers. This increase may be partially explained by three factors including: an increased interest in professional organizations by pharmacy students, an increasing number of chapters which admit women into the brotherhood and the increasing numbers of colleges of pharmacy which have switched to the Doctor of Pharmacy as the entry level degree for

practice. Whatever the cause, I see more young men and women participating in Kappa Psi and I see Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity reaching membership heights previously unachieved in the history of this fraternity.

Development: Last summer, chapters from Provinces V and VI petitioned the Executive Committee to merge. The Committee approved the merger pending no dissent from chapters upon further notification. The deadline for such notice passed on November 1, 1988 with no dissent. Therefore the **Provinces** were officially merged and shall henceforth be called **PROVINCE V.** We look forward to more dynamic activities from these chapters and their contributions to the brotherhood and to the Fraternity.

During the past two years, thanks to the strong support for increased funding through dues increases by the delegation in attendance at the 43rd GCC, the Central Office was able to fund a more aggressive program of Chapter visitations during the past two years. Although the visits were delayed for six months awaiting official replies from chapters via Province Satraps, a program of directed visitations was implemented targeting especially those chapters which were believed to benefit most from such activity.

Three years ago we reorganized our program for receiving contributions and gifts from brothers and friends of the fraternity. This reorganization effort coupled with the development of a national directory of all Kappa Psi brothers provided the resources necessary to conduct a national campaign to bring more graduate brothers into informed positions about current fraternity activities as well as bring them into a graduate dues paying status. Today, our alumni national dues paying graduate brothers are among the highest in our history and the gift program has grown by astounding proportions. The Grand Regent's Club (\$1,000 gifts to the fraternity) has ten members, the Bicentennial Club (\$500 gifts to the fraternity) has almost seventy members, the Scarlet & Gray Club (\$250 gifts to the fraternity) has five members and the 99ers Club (\$99 gifts to the fraternity) has forty members. I urge each of you to review these programs and the roster of benevolent brothers which are periodically published in THE MASK. This gifts program has provided your fraternity with almost \$50,000 in funds, most of which has been pledged or given during the past three years, for special projects and services

which we wouldn't have without the concern of alumni brothers, their love for the fraternity and their desire to make Kappa Psi even better than it is today. Brothers in attendance, I challenge each of you to search your fraternal soul and ask yourself just what will your role be in assuring Kappa Psi a fulfilling and successful future.

In addition, I would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge the fantastic support of the friends of Kappa Psi from the pharmaceutical industry, colleges and universities and other sources. Their contributions to this convention have exceeded \$10,000, by far the greatest demonstration of financial support ever received from these sources. Please review your programs for the list of sponsors and the special events made possible by our supporters.

Image: Throughout my term in office I have encouraged all brothers to commit themselves to scholarship, professionalism, leadership, community service and recognition of jobs well done by utilizing our awards and recognition programs. I am pleased to report that we have observed increased participation in each program over the past two years. Participation has been so great that the Central Office from time to time ran out of certificates requested for deserving brothers. I am especially pleased that so many of our brothers are being recognized for their scholastic achievement and campus leadership. Brothers, knowledge is power. If you and I intend to have a meaningful career, a career filled with excitement, accomplishment, challenges and successes, then we must be prepared today to commit ourselves to a career of lifelong learning. I believe there could be no greater gift to the brotherhood from Kappa Psi than the encouragement to be the best, to aggressively pursue excellence in scholarship, sports, leadership, professional and community service. A preoccupation with these activities in Kappa Psi will foster goodwill among the brothers, with the Colleges and Universities, throughout the profession and among our fellowman.

Yes, we also established a much more rigid hazing policy as well as an alcohol and substance abuse policy. These policies have been well publicized. Special mailings have been directed to Regents, Grand Council Deputies, Deans and Administrators. We want there to be NO confusion regarding the official position of the Fraternity on these very important issues of our times.

Our recognition program was formalized to include special awards at the Annual

APhA Reception. In 1988 we honored Brother George Griffenhagen for more than forty years of outstanding service to the profession. He was presented the Grand Council Citation of Appreciation. Likewise, this year in Anaheim, California, Brother Ray Gosselin was honored by presentation of the Grand Council Citation of Appreciation for his outstanding service to pharmacy education and the profession. Brothers, our profession is filled with individuals, Kappa Psi brothers who have given their lives, their professional careers to the betterment of mankind through pharmacy. I trust that each of you appreciate and acknowledge their achievements, but even more so, that you acknowledge that many of them will soon be leaving the profession therefore creating a void in leadership, a void in wisdom and scholarship, a void in enthusiasm. I am confident that each of you, as demonstrated by your presence here today, are willing to accept the challenge, are determined to plan for both our fraternity and our profession, are willing to spearhead growth and development for both our fraternity and our profession and are willing to insist upon the utmost dignity and respect for Kappa Psi and for Pharmacy so that our image as individuals and as a collective body will always be that which we can ultimately be proud.

In closing I wish to thank the Executive Committee for their hard work, to each of you for your dedication to Kappa Psi, a special appreciation to Bob and Charmain Magarian for their unselfish devotion to this Fraternity and finally to my wife Kittye and my daughters Millicent and LouAnne for their patience and understanding during my absences and their constant support to help me be more effective in my responsibilities. It has been my esteemed honor to have served this great order, and each of you, my brothers. I will always treasure this recognition that you bestowed upon me. Thank you for your kindness, your support and your understanding. May we always be mindful and hold true our motto "One for all and all for one."

Tanja elected President

Grand Council Convention: The 43rd Grand Council Convention was held August 9-14 in Orlando, Florida. Convention Chairman Dr. Henry Lewis, his staff and the Host Chapter, Delta Iota, did an admirable job in preparing for the 112 collegiates, 72 graduates and 29 guests that were in attendance. Three (3) issues of major concern were the following: a) a dues increase, b) Province realignment and c) separation of the offices of Grand Historian-Ritualist. After much deliberation, the results were as follows:

- a) collegiate dues would increase from 22 to \$30.00 per year and graduate dues would be \$25.00. Funds generated from the increase (e.g. \$8.00 collegiate) for the first year were to be placed aside until input could be made via the Province.
- b) no Province realignment occurred but the Executive Committee was directed to continue to explore appropriate ways and means to accommodate realignment where necessary;
- c) The office of Grand Historian-Ritualist was to stay as is. The following were elected at the GCC: Grand Regent Kenneth B. Roberts Grand Vice Regent William R. Smith Grand Counselor Johnny W. 




Kappa Psi's Grand Council Scholarship Key is awarded to those Brothers who graduate first in their class. This year we are proud to announce the three winners.



The importance of history and rituals

Initially, my interest in the History and Rituals of Kappa Psi was precisely that, interest. As my understanding came to increase and my curiosity deepened, I realized one day that what I really felt toward our History and Rituals was respect and love. In other words, I actually came to feel and appreciate our History and take to heart the lessons of the Rituals. We in Kappa Psi are truly blessed to have such a rich heritage, a heritage that allows us to grow stronger every time we share that heritage.

By the time we leave this Assembly, we will be refreshed and renewed by returning to our basics: our History, our Rituals, and our Heritage.

Our personal fraternal history now covers one-hundred-ten years. Think for a moment about May 30, 1879 and put it into a personal perspective of your own families. This date is probably somewhere near the birth dates of your great-great-grandparents. Further, at the time of the founding of Kappa Psi, your own great-great-great-grandparents were about the same age as you are now. Thus, Kappa Psi has touched the lives of six generations, and now as you and your contemporaries go forth and multiply, a seventh generation.

I should like to briefly touch on three areas of our History with you: Review, Appreciate, and Record. Each Chapter has a moral duty to its membership and antecedents to occasionally review portions of the History of the Fraternity at large and of the Local Chapter in particular. This reviewing process need not be elaborate or time consuming for the Historian. One example that has been successfully employed in a number of Chapters is, to once a month read aloud at a Chapter Meeting a Chapter News Letter from an issue of the MASK of ten, twenty, forty, fifty, etc., years ago. Additionally, the 1967 "History of Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity" by Frank H. Eby is a marvelous resource refer-

ence. Your college library should have a copy if your Chapter doesn't. We should, also, take the time to review some of our history with each pledge class. It is most important that neophytes realize from day number one that there is much, much more to fraternity life in Kappa Psi than studying for exams and end of semester parties.

Aside from occasionally reviewing our history either as a group or as individuals, it is most important that we come to appreciate and understand our history, lest we repeat our predecessor's errors! It is also good for us to occasionally recognize the hard work and good efforts of our forbearers. and ask ourselves how we can continue to utilize and build upon the foundation which has preceded us. Quite often an appreciation of history allows us to come up with a "brand new thirty or forty year old idea," or it allows us to put a new "spin" on an old idea and adopt it to serve our current needs.

The next action concerning our history is obvious, Record it! Had some Brothers not taken the time to record events twenty, forty, sixty, or seventy-five years ago, what would we have to draw upon today? The two most important functions of a Chapter Historian are: 1) to keep a good scrap book, and 2) to submit four ON TIME articles to the *MASK*, annually. Do this now and Brothers yet unborn will thank you or revere your memory fifty

or one-hundred years from now!

There is no need to fear that you do not have the ability to be a master journalist or writer, few of us do! All that is needed is to look at the two, or three, or four, or five most important events in your Chapter during the previous three months and answer the following questions about each: Who? What? When? Where? Why? and How? Four or five sentences about each topic, and "BINGO!" You have an article or news letter.

In our Handbook, which I have recently finished revising, there is one paragraph, which to the neophyte is the single most important paragraph that can be found, as it states our objectives. I should like to take just a moment to review it with you.

"The Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, by intent, design, and organization is a professionally oriented social order bringing together for a common cause individuals in Pharmacy of diverse religious, ethnic, economic and social backgrounds. The Fraternity has as its stated cause a Fraternal organization for the mutual benefits of its members; advancement for pharmacy, educationally, fraternally, and socially; the inculcation of industry, sobriety, fellowship, and high ideals among its members; the fostering of scholarship and research in pharmacy; and the advancement of the community through professional service."

In that passage were four key principles—five words that are emphasized many times in our Rituals: Fellowship, Industry, Sobriety, and High Ideals. In this revised order the "FISH" of Kappa Psi—an easy way to remember the basis of our lives as Brothers in Kappa Psi.

1. Fellowship or brotherly love is the bond that will provide you with friendships that will extend for a life time, But, with this gift comes the responsibility of kindness, consideration, respect, and understanding.

2. Industry is always the key to success in any undertaking. We attain little of value by relying on chance or luck. We must make our own brakes through diligence, perseverance, and followthrough; these are the keys of industry. I think often of a quotation, many times repeated by Past Grand Regent Dewey D. Garner: "to fail to plan, is to plan to fail." Think about that one often! It epitomizes the spirit of industry.

Ask yourself... Will this have a positive impact?

3. Sobriety—the sober minded Brother is not to be equated with a lack of fun or spontaneity; rather, sobriety denotes moderation, consideration, understanding and caring; always considering what the results will be of a particular action; and constantly endeavoring to live a worthy and useful life. The sober minded Brother ALWAYS asks: "Will this act have a positive influence on and/or for the

Brotherhood?"

Fellowship, Industry, Sobriety, and High Ideals are for me a major part of the sustaining influence of our Rituals. But, for the Rituals to be a meaningful part of our lives, they must be used more often than twice a year for initiations. Our Rituals are unique, they make us unique, no other group has them, or can use them! Our Rituals are common from one generation of Brothers to another. They remind us of our rich heritage and reinforce our noble values. Our Ritual Book, in the Preamble, directs us to hold at least one meeting per month that is formally opened and closed by Ritual. I very strongly recommend that ALL meet-

ings be opened and closed with the Ritual. There are two different options for opening a meeting by Ritual, and two different options for closing a meeting by Ritual, depending on meeting location. Each takes only two to three minutes to conduct. I cannot think of a better way to spend two or three minutes than thinking about and being reminded of our most noble goals! Take those extra two minutes to open your Chapter Meetings with the Ritual. Take those extra two minutes to close your Chapter Meetings with the Ritual. This is the stuff that characterizes your Fraternity; it is why you are unique; don't ever forget it!

Use of the opening Ritual by its very nature causes each Brother to be a participant in, rather than just an observer of the Meeting. Instantly, every Brother present becomes intimately involved in the meeting process.

Page five of the Ritual Book provides for the Order of Business. Adherence to the Order of Business will insure two things for your Chapter: 1) no item of important business will be omitted; 2) meetings will be efficiently organized and flow smoothly.

To compliment the Official Order of Business, the Central Office has available Official Minutes Pages for the use of your Chapter Secretary. These pages are pre-printed to correspond to the Official Order of Business and cost 4¢ each. They are well worth the very small investment.

Use of the Closing Ritual is most important; it reminds us of our heritage, our purpose, our obligations, and allows us to depart with both strength and direction in our every day lives.

Our History and our Rituals provide us with our rich heritage. We are very special because of our heritage, at times, perhaps, the envy of those who wish they were Kappa Psi. We, the guardians of life, the Brothers from the Breeding Ground of Leadership, have a destiny to lead our profession. From the day that we swore our oath of obligation, our lives were changed, never to be the same again. On that day of oath taking we did not just join a social club. Rather, in becoming a Member of Kappa Psi, we committed our lives, on that day and for ever more, to noble purpose!






