







Pharmacy Here and Abroad

"One's destination is never a place, but a new way of seeing things" —Henry Miller

Kappa Psi brothers take opportunities to gain knowledge and develop skills that will further enhance their journey in the field of pharmacy. Epsilon Sigma Brother Payal Kapadia was presented with the opportunity to study abroad in parts of Ireland and the United Kingdom this past summer. Her insight from the trip provides many vantage points as understanding differences in the various health systems can progress our own profession in the United States.

The University of Florida's College of Pharmacy study abroad program affords the students and professors alike the ability to gain worldly experiences while understanding more about the pharmacy profession. One of the most prominent differences in the healthcare models between that of Ireland and United Kingdom versus the United States is the hot button issue of funding. The result of these various systems affects how the pharmacies operate. 



EXAMINING ELDERLY PATIENTS' PERSPECTIVE TOWARDS PHARMACY SERVICE – TRUST, SATISFACTION AND PREFERENCE

Methods
 A cross-sectional survey was conducted among elderly patients (65 years and older) at a community pharmacy. The survey assessed their trust, satisfaction, and preference for pharmacy services. Data was analyzed using SPSS software.

Results: Demographics



Discussion
 The study found that elderly patients generally have a positive perception of community pharmacy services. The majority of respondents (85%) agreed that community pharmacies are a convenient place to get their prescriptions. This finding is consistent with previous research that highlights the accessibility and convenience of community pharmacies for elderly patients. The study also identified areas for improvement, such as the need for more staff training and enhanced patient education services. The results suggest that community pharmacies should continue to focus on providing high-quality, patient-centered care to meet the needs of the elderly population.

Limitation
 The study was limited to a single community pharmacy, which may not be representative of all community pharmacies. Future research should include a larger, multi-site study to validate these findings.

Conclusion
 Community pharmacies play a vital role in providing accessible and convenient pharmacy services for elderly patients. The study highlights the importance of maintaining high standards of service and staff training to ensure patient satisfaction and trust. Community pharmacies should continue to evolve and adapt to the needs of the elderly population to remain a preferred choice for their pharmacy services.


