

Once again, the highlight of the American Pharmaceutical Association annual meeting for Kappa Psi brothers was the Kappa Psi activities. More than 300 brothers visited the exhibit booth at the Moscone Convention Center in San Francisco.

Executive Director and brother Scott Long, and all of the Executive Committee, greeted the brothers. They renewed old acquaintances and made many new ones. A major theme of the booth was the Grand Council Convention in August in Ft. Lauderdale. At the booth, brothers had the opportunity to meet many legends of the Fraternity, including past Grand Regents and graduate brothers. There was ample opportunity to compare experiences within the fraternity and realize that our strength sometimes lies in our differences as well as mutual experiences as a brotherhood.

Another wonderful experience was the opportunity to attend the annual reception on Sunday afternoon where brothers met the Executive Committee and witnessed the presentation of the A. Richard Bliss Citation of Appreciation to one of the Kappa Psi legends, Norman A. Campbell. Brother Campbell's acceptance speech was indeed a highlight. He told us what Kappa Psi means to him and exhibited his deep and lasting appreciation and love for the opportunities that the Fraternity has offered him. In typical fashion, brother Campbell related how he thought he did not deserve the award. However, when one remembers the contributions of his career, it is apparent he is very deserving of this award. Brother Campbell was one of the founders of the Kappa Psi Foundation and a driving force behind the scenes in the growth of the Foundation. He is also a founding member of the American Society of Pharmacy Law. For many brothers, it was their chance to meet a living legend who was Grand Regent before many of the new initiates were even born. Although he has had a long career in the profession and the Fraternity, probably the highlight for brother Campbell and many of the brothers was the chance to meet his family, most of whom were there. Again, the reception was a wonderful opportunity to meet other Kappa Psi brothers.

As expected, the Kappa Psi presence at the A.Ph.A. meeting was felt throughout the meeting. There was clear and convincing evidence that Kappa Psi brothers are indeed leaders in the profession. The most commonly heard phrase was "See you in August at G.C.C."





Alcohol and Hazing Policies BREWING **Statement on Risk Management** Risk management may be defined as taking appropriate measures to minimize risk to

ensure the safety and well-being of members and nonmembers interacting with the chapters, province, or the Fraternity in any way.

Policy

The Risk Management Policy of the Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. involves an ongoing educational program that includes the provisions covered below as part of collegiate chapter, province and international leadership training sessions and publications. All alumni, especially those working with collegiate chapters, are encouraged to take training in risk management and be positive role models for collegiate members by demonstrating responsible behavior and supporting risk management policies.

Chapters and Provinces Will:

- 1. Become cognizant of ways to reduce risk by working to identify any action which could result in injury or death.
- 2. Encourage members to plan all events with incorporated measures that will protect each member or non-
- 3. Analyze the risks involved in actions before they are taken and plan events so that exposure to liability is mini-
- 4. Remove all risks associated with hazing and alcohol. The Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. has well-established policies on hazing and alcohol abuse. (This Fraternity does not condone and will not tolerate hazing by any member, chapter, or province). All members of the Fraternity, collegiate or alumni, are aware of these policies, and pledges are also instructed on these policies.
- 5. Prevent situations that facilitate illegal drinking, the abuse of alcohol, or substance abuse in any form.
- 6. Conduct an "Activity Risk Assessment" before hosting a function for the chapter, province, or Fraternity. A list of assessments to be considered shall be developed by each chapter, province, or Fraternity, and may include the following: a. What liability does the chapter or province foresee in the upcoming event? b. List the problems that could arise; c. How would each of these problems be solved? d. What safeguards are being implemented in case the event gets out of hand? e. Will any city, county, or state ordinances be violated? f. Have the chapter policies, university rules and college rules been checked so they are not violated? g. Determine how the chapter officers will maintain control over this event; and h. Is the liability worth the benefits of the event?

All alumni, especially those working with collegiate chapters, are encouraged to take training in risk management and be positive role models for collegiate members by demonstrating responsible behavior and supporting risk management policies.

Hazing

The Kappa Psi Hazing Policy defines hazing as any physical or mental harassment. Specifically, hazing includes, but is not limited to, the following: a. Any form of forced physical exercise; b. Any activity that might reasonably be expected to cause embarrassment or psychological harm to the individual; c. Any activity that might reasonably be expected to bring physical harm to the individual; d. Any activity that might reasonably be expected to degrade or otherwise compromise the dignity of the individual; e. Any activity that might reasonably be expected to require an unreasonable or inordinate amount of the individual's time, or in any manner impair the individual's academic efforts; f. Any activity that might reasonably be expected to make the individual an object of ridicule; g. The required consumption of any liquid or solid matter; or h. Any requirement which compels an individual to participate in any activity that is illegal or contrary to the individual's genuine moral and/or religious beliefs or contrary to the rules and regulations of the educational institution. All acts of hazing by a chapter or any of its members or alumni are specifically forbidden.

Alcohol and Substance Abuse

The Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. is committed to providing members information on which to base attitudes toward the role of alcohol in their personal lives, in group settings and in the practice environment. The Fraternity seeks to be a positive influence in helping members avoid problems which can be directly linked to the unenlightened use of alcohol and substances in general. Substance abuse in any form, be it through the abuse of alcohol, the use of illegal substances, or the abuse of controlled substances is unconditionally condemned by the Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc.

Chapters and Provinces Shall:

- 1. Not have alcohol as the central focus of any event and will not advertise that alcohol might be present. Other activities are encouraged such as, dancing, sports, or other types of games.
- 2. Not sponsor any event not in compliance with any and all legal permits under the regulation of sale and use laws of the local jurisdiction, state, or province and university.
- 3. Make available at all social events sufficient food and non-alcoholic refreshments, which must be accessible to all guests.
- 4. Not spend chapter funds to purchase alcohol. There can be no chapter-sanctioned pooling of funds. This usually means that any alcohol present must be brought by the person intending to consume it (BYOB). Chapter funds can be used to buy non-alcoholic beverages and other refreshments.
- 5. Not permit mass containers (kegs, party balls, punch bowls, etc.) even if brought by individuals.

- 6. Not have open parties without a guest list. The guest list must be filed with the appropriate local authorities 24 hours in advance and must be limited to no more than two guests per member.
- 7. Check IDs of all guests and members. Individuals over 21 must be identified in some manner such as a bracelet, stamp on hand, etc.
- 8. Arrange for a nonmember to check IDs. Most commonly, this means campus or hired security officers.
- 9. Not co-sponsor an open event with an establishment that sells alcohol either at the establishment or otherwise. Same for alcohol distributors, etc.
- 10. Rent an establishment or banquet facility provided a licensed bartender is selling the alcohol or managing the alcohol brought by guests (BYOB). Guests lists, carding, etc. must still be in effect at these functions.
 - 11. Conduct seminars on alcohol awareness/health education topics.
- 12. Not allow drinking, formally or informally, during rush or with prospective members. No alcohol may be involved, formally or informally, during member education with pledges.
 - 13. Initiate ways, which must be in place, to prevent impaired driving.
- 14. Ensure that a certain number of members remain sober to act as party monitors during events, and these individuals must be readily identifiable (wearing jackets, hats, armbands, etc.).

Sexual Harassment

Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. explicitly condemns and will not tolerate any form of sexually abusive behavior. It is the responsibility of each member to behave in such a manner that their words or actions cannot reasonably be perceived as sexually coercive, abusive or exploitative.

Education

Each chapter will take the responsibility of annually instructing each member and pledge on the Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. Risk Management Policy. In addition, each chapter will notify The Central Office on a special form supplied in the Fall Packet once such instructions are performed. Each chapter and province will develop its own Risk Management Guidelines and send a copy to The Central Office. The provinces will also strive to educate annually the chapters in their province through scheduled workshops or seminars. The international leadership will educate the membership through mailings, the Kappa Psi publication (*The Mask*) and workshops at the biennial Grand Council Convention.







Richard Morrison Doughty

Richard Morrison Doughty (1921-2000) was the husband of Gloria Hartman Doughty and the son of the late James Clifford and Lilan Morrison Doughty of Sewickley, Pennsylvania. He was born in Sewickley in 1921 and graduated high school there in 1939. Dick earned a B.S. in secondary education in 1948 and a M. S. in botany in 1954 from the University of Pittsburgh. He pursued the Ph.D. in botany at Indiana University from 1958-1961.

During World War II, Dick served in the Army Medical Department in North Africa, Burma and India. He completed his college work upon discharge from the service. Dick was employed by the University of Pittsburgh School of Pharmacy as an instructor until 1951 when he joined the teaching staff at the University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy in Louisville. He moved to Lexington with the College of Pharmacy in 1957. Dick retired from the university as an associate professor in 1986.

His academic areas included pharmacognosy, the study of natural products and microbiology. During his tenure with the university, Dick was faculty advisor to the Upsilon chapter of Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity and Grand Ritualist to the National Fraternity. He was later designated as the Grand Ritualist Emeritus of the Fraternity. He was a member, and the secretary and president of the University of Kentucky chapter of Sigma Psi, the research society of North America. He also served on that organization's national board of directors for three years. Dick was an active faculty member of Omicron Delta Kappa from 1980 until his retirement. He served as representative from the College of Pharmacy on the national board of directors of the University of Kentucky Alumni Association for six years. In 1968, Dick was appointed assistant to the dean for student/alumni affairs at the College of Pharmacy in which he supervised admissions to the college, student activities and alumni relations. In 1985, the College of Pharmacy presented Dick with the Distinguished Kentuckian in Pharmacy award.

Dick was an associate member and editor of the newsletter for the Blue Grass Pharmacists Association for several years. Dick was a member of and served as president and secretary (1989-1999 for the Burley Kiwanis Club. He served an unprecedented three terms as lieutenant governor, division 10 of the Kentucky/Tennessee district of Kiwanis (1987, 1989 and 1992). His greatest charitable interests were in the Head Start program during his tenure as lieutenant governor. He initiated the founding of the Kiwanis Head Start Center in Lexington. He was recognized as Volunteer of the Year by Community Action Lexington/Fayette County and the Southeast U.S. region of Head Start, He served on the "friends" committee of Head Start. Since 1990, Dick grew a beard each year so he could serve as Santa Claus to the Head Start centers, nursing homes and local hospitals.

Since retirement, Dick assisted his wife, Gloria, a consultant pharmacist in nursing home visitations. He is survived by his wife, four sisters, and 11 nieces and nephews in Florida, Louisiana and Pennsylvania.



Kappa Psi-Why Me, Why You?

Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity is a professional fraternity that demands many ideals to be upheld by its members. Among these are the four principles of Fellowship, Industry Sobriety, and High Ideals. By teaching these principles to its members, Kappa Psi helps professionalize pharmacy students so they can help advance the profession of pharmacy. Each one of these stan-

dards has contributed to molding me into the professional I am today, and will continue to have a strong presence within me as I make critical decisions as a health care professional.

The first principle, Fellowship, is an association of equal individuals with common interests. I started a shadowing program for members who wanted to become officers in the future. In addition, through my leadership, I helped in doubling the size of our chapter this past year. Not only have I been industrious within the chapter, but I have also contributed a lot of time outside of Kappa Psi in hope of advancing pharmacy practice. I have assisted the Immanuel Drug Information Center in several studies to show the value of pharmacists. One of our studies showed that the hospital could save nearly half a million dollars annually through proper conversion of patients from intravenous drugs to their oral equivalents.

I was also a teaching assistant in Parenterals Lab, assisting students with the development of their aseptic technique, among other things. I have also assisted nurses by providing two separate in-service lectures on medications used to treat diabetes. And to continue m0000y effort to advance the profession of pharmacy, I co-wrote a grant in an attempt to implement diabetes care centers in local pharmacies.

The third principle taught to all Kappa Psi brothers is Sobriety. Personally, I have found this to be a rather daunting task, one that is more of an acquired or learned principle. It can be difficult to maintain an equal balance between, school, work, my personal life, and Kappa Psi activities. I take my work, my career, and personal life very seriously. Each year, I feel that I have improved in moderating the amount of involvement I have in all. However, things constantly change in one's life, so it is key to try to find a happy medium between all the facets. For example, this past year I have been planning a wedding with my fiancée, which requires a lot of time. However, I have managed to find time for my brothers here at Creighton, but also the brothers in our region. Kappa Psi teaches us to accomplish this through goal setting, and revising those goals once they have been achieved.

This is a very important principle that has been taught to me as a Kappa Psi brother. Not only have I set goals for our chapter, but I have also continued to set goals for myself, every semester, since coming to Creighton. 
