Make an Impact

Brothers,


How is it possible that half of the academic year has already come and gone? It feels like yesterday we were in Naples for the 58th Grand Council Convention and suddenly we are months away from the 59th Grand Council Convention in Washington, D.C.! Sometimes it is important as the time flies by to take a step back and see where we were, what we have done and where we are going. In my reflection of the trajectory of the Fraternity, I am extremely optimistic that we continue to pursue a path that safeguards longevity and one that ensures we make a positive impact in our schools and our communities. While there are always missteps or struggles, as a whole, a Fraternity as diverse and passionate as ours has a bright future.

As we look toward the 59th GCC and all of its great opportunities, it's good to take a moment to think about what impact we have had over the first three-quarters of the current term and how we can all continue to "Make an Impact" in the time period remaining before we arrive in Washington, D.C., in July. Let's take a look at some steps we have taken:

- We have made strides to enhance Kappa Psi's involvement in community and professional advocacy by encouraging chapters to participate and rewarding them with those points in the Chapter Progress Report Form (CPRF).
- We have taken steps to provide more connection between the International Executive Committee and collegiate chapters through the chapter visitation process pioneered by the Chapter Enhancement Task Force and have conducted three visits with up to three more to come.
- We have given chapters opportunities to work more proactively toward excellence through early release of the CPRF so chapters know how to structure their yearly activities (this is posted to the international website for those who have not yet seen it— <https://kappapsi.com/collegiates>).
- We have expanded our social media presence by increasing our Twitter and Instagram presence as well as improving our approach to online forms, tools (GoToWebinar, etc) and updating our international website.
- We have expanded our educational resources for collegiate, graduates and GCDs through recorded and preserved webinars.
- We have started the process of completely revamping our graduate awards to a more meaningful and insightful program to better highlight the accomplishments of our graduate chapters.
- We are exploring a new program, Society 1879, for improving graduate retention and engagement and providing more direct value back to our graduate members.
- We have digitized all of our past issues of *THE MASK* so brothers from all generations can see the past and future of our great Fraternity (<http://kappapsiarchives.org>).
- We continue to grow and develop our Biennial Leadership Symposium (next up 2020!) for continued development of our members into future leaders in the profession.
- We have established a new philanthropic partnership, Reach Out and Read, that our Fraternity has already contributed almost \$20,000 toward and we have awarded our first ten \$1,000 service grants to chapters developing great new programs for this partnership.

This is just a brief overview of everything we, as a Fraternity, have done over the last year and a half and will continue to improve and develop over the remaining months. If you want to continue to be a part of this, make plans NOW to attend the 59th Grand Council Convention so you can learn about the many other ways you, along with all of your Kappa Psi brothers, can continue to "Make an Impact."

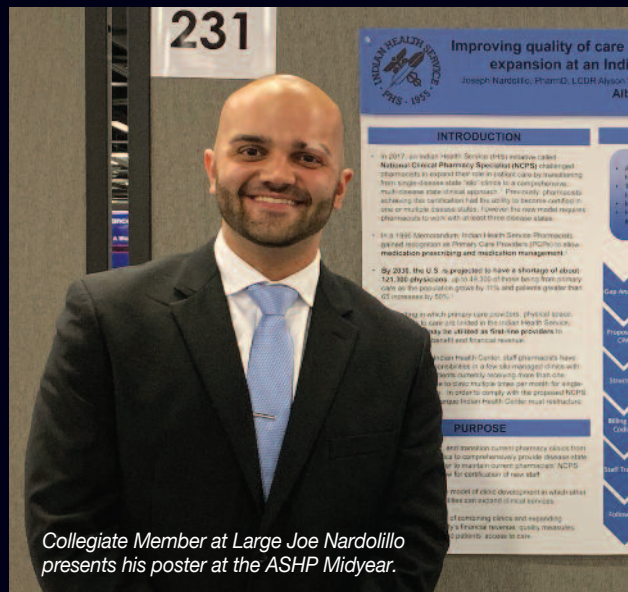

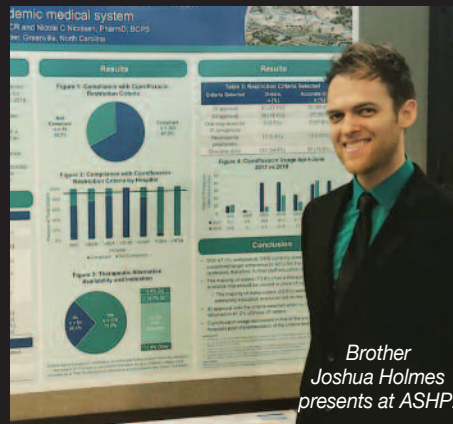

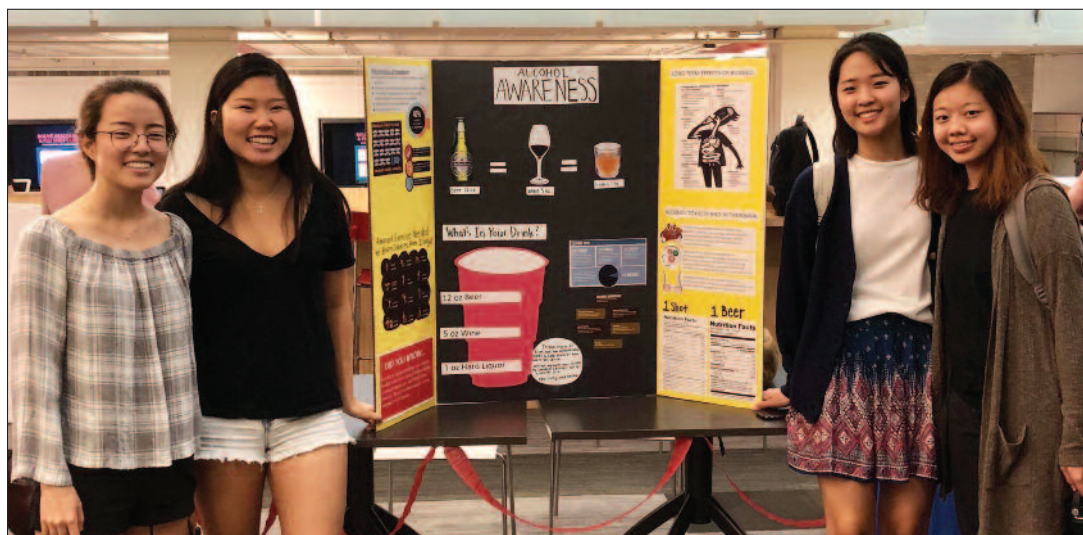

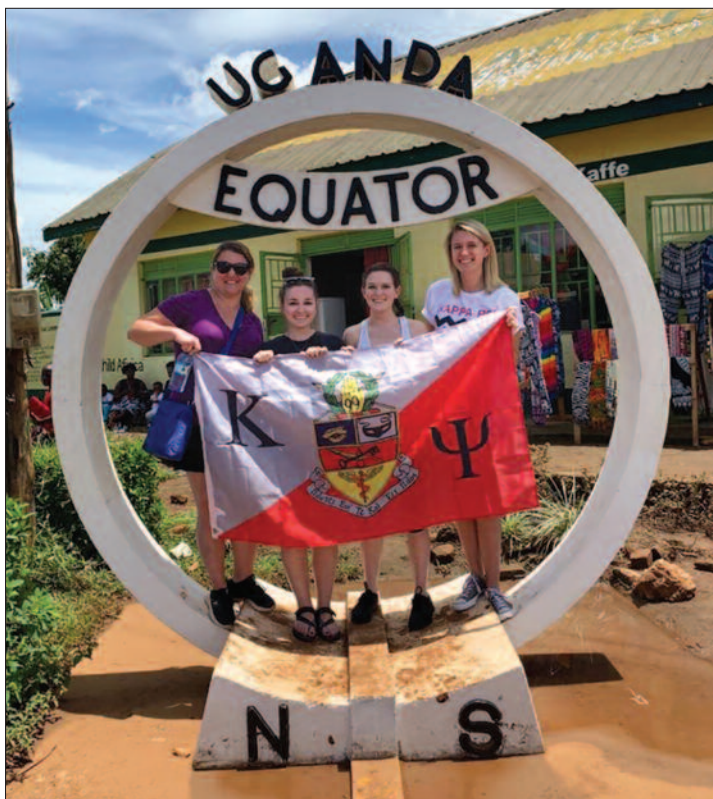

We held several professional events this semester. Brothers honed patient care skills at two blood pressure/blood glucose screening events. The first was located at our local farmers



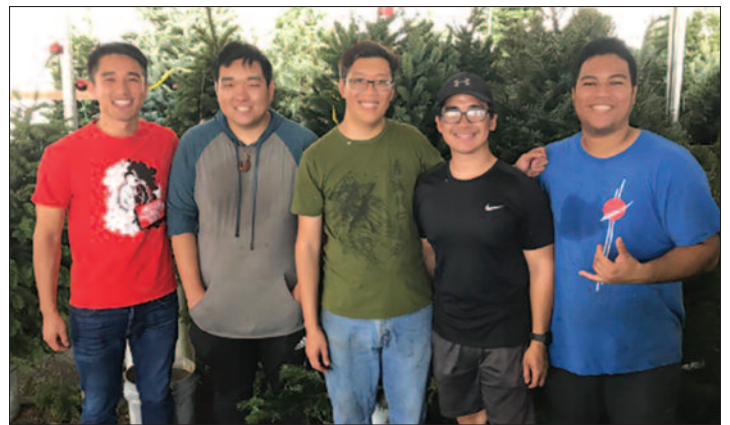

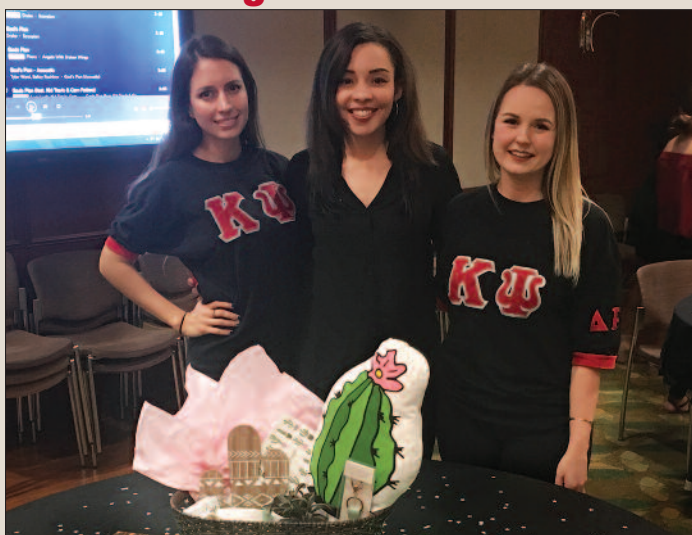

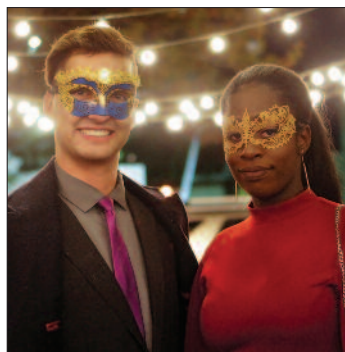

The article shown below was published in the first issue of *THE MASK* in 1904. It states, "The greatest drawback the Fraternity has to contend with, and one that is very easily remedied, is the lack of interest shown the Fraternity by the members after they graduated." To help connect graduates to the Fraternity, *THE MASK* was created. One hundred and fifteen years later, we continue to discuss the "easily remedied" issues to foster ongoing involvement of graduate brothers.

During the years as a collegiate brother, many friendships are formed, experiences gained, and memories made. All three of these remain after graduation. However, just because you graduate from school does not mean your experiences as a brother cannot continue. Over the past 11 years as a graduate brother, I have made many new friendships and gained additional skills through experiences and lifelong memories. Pride and dedication to the Fraternity begins with pledging, which should involve both collegiate and graduate brothers to demonstrate that Kappa Psi is for life. Similarly, important to pledging is when brothers approach graduation during their

final year of school. Not only is this an important year as professional careers begin, but also as collegiates transition to graduate brothers. How does your chapter celebrate these brothers? How does your chapter encourage ongoing involvement in the Fraternity? Do not let the soon-to-be graduates fade away!

I encourage you to ask yourself what 'Kappa Psi for Life' and being an active graduate brother means to you. Does it mean being involved in a chapter, paying voluntary dues or donating to the Kappa Psi Foundation? Or going to a Province assembly or a Grand Council Convention? Involvement with the Fraternity as a graduate can be challenging at times. Participation can ebb and flow with careers, families and other responsibilities. However, if we are proud of and dedicated to our Fraternity, then graduates can continue to serve the Brotherhood in various ways, including mentoring collegiate brothers, presenting a workshop or CE session, or creating a rotation site. Being a Grand Council Deputy, serving on a Province or International committee or serving as a chapter, Province or International Officer are other ways to continue to be active within the Brotherhood. The possibilities of involvement are vast and go beyond paying voluntary dues. Graduate chapters can also help accommodate involvement by inviting recent graduates to chapter meetings, facilitating professional events, and hosting social activities. When planning social events, incorporating family-friendly activities are important to encourage unity among family and Fraternity.

The success and growth of the Brotherhood relies on the retention of brothers. We have made progress since the article published in 1904, but further progress can be made. We should challenge ourselves to continue demonstrating the same pride and dedication to the Fraternity both as collegiate and graduate brothers. The impact that graduates can have on the Brotherhood is limitless, so ask yourself: How will you continue the legacy of Kappa Psi? How will history remember you?

TO PASSIVE MEMBERS

The greatest drawback the Fraternity has to contend with, and one which could be very easily remedied, is the lack of interest shown the Fraternity by the members after they have graduated.

A man goes through his collegiate course in two, three or four years—as the case may be; and, while in College, he enjoys all the privileges of the Agora and forms many pleasant friendships, which, in after years, he looks back on with much satisfaction. Graduation day arrives, and, after he receives his diploma, he leaves for parts unknown, and that is the last we hear of him—he apparently forgets his "Frat," and it is only one case in fifty where we hear from him at all.

Better spirit should be shown. Surely all the pleasant recollections and happy gatherings you enjoyed while an Active Member should count for something; apparently it does not. The Fraternity wants to feel that every graduate member is still interested in the work at hand, and would, if necessary, do anything within reason to help it along.

How to get the passive members interested was one of the main themes discussed at the recent convention, and, after much deliberation, it was decided to publish a monthly paper devoted to the interests of the Fraternity, and setting forth the news of each Chapter, in order that the passive members could keep in touch with the work of Kappa Psi.

If this paper is to be a success it must have the support of every graduate; every passive man must lend his financial assistance, and that means you must subscribe. One dollar a year is all it costs, an amount many of you spend in an evening five times over.

If you are still loyal to your Fraternity and want to see it succeed in all it starts out to undertake, send in your subscription at once, in order that we may have the means of carrying on the work. This paper is started for your benefit. It means work and lots of it for those who get it out, and it deserves your patronage at least. *WILL YOU GIVE IT?*
