


Brothers,

Ted Gladson

Chi '59, University of Illinois-Chicago College of Pharmacy

Pharmacist, Entrepreneur, Mentor

Ted Gladson is a registered pharmacist and renowned expert in consumer product merchandising and store design. In 1966, he developed the first retail picture planogram. *See more on page 8.* During his long career, he helped change the face of community pharmacy and retailing in general.

Upon graduating from the UIC-College of Pharmacy, Ted practiced as a pharmacist in many venues encompassing chain and retail pharmacy including hospital pharmacy, wholesaling and pharmaceutical sales. Ted has also instructed pharmacy students as adjunct assistant professor and advised countless others as an industry consultant.

In 1971, he founded Gladson Interactive and remained its president until its sale in 2005. During his business career, he presented numerous retail management lectures for state and national conventions, pharmaceutical manufacturers, both national and international, and at various colleges of pharmacy nationwide and internationally. His company assisted the U.S. military in layout and product management in the commissaries and exchanges both in the U.S. and overseas. He assumed teaching responsibilities at his alma mater, the University of Illinois-Chicago and also at the University of Utah.

Ted's company, Gladson Interactive (now called Syndigo), remains the leader in product image and dimension database development with more than 1.5 million consumer products available to vendors and retailers worldwide. The company is considered to be the leader not only in new planogram development, but also in retail store design. The company has been involved in designing more than 5,000 pharmacies nationally and internationally.

Additionally, Ted conducted more than 300 industry seminars and wrote more than 200 articles and columns for trade publications, including *Drug Store News*, *American Pharmacist*, *National Community Pharmacists Association*, *Drug Topics*,


Pharmacy Times, Progressive Grocer, Strictly Business Magazine, Point of Purchase Advertising Institute and AC Nielsen. He co-authored Drugstore Guide to Selling and Merchandising. He also founded Pharmacy Enterprise Systems, Inc., where he functioned as the organization's president for more than a decade.

Ted and his wife, Jean, recently provided the funding and creative talent to create the University of Illinois-Chicago College of Pharmacy's Alumni Room, a conference room that highlights the history of pharmacy with several museum-grade displays. (See more on the Alumni Room/museum page 6.) They also established the Ted R. and Jean L. Gladson Family Scholarship at UIC. The endowed scholarship recognizes the impact that the college and Fraternity had on Ted's life and will support Kappa Psi brothers now and in perpetuity.

Brother Gladson has been a longtime dues-paying brother and a constant supporter of the Kappa Psi Foundation. He was appointed as Graduate Representative on the Executive Committee from 1979–1981. He also taught CE sessions on merchandising and retail management during Grand Council Conventions in the late 1970s and early 1980s, as well as attended many Province meetings and Grand Council Conventions.

From Mess to Museum

Brother Ted Gladson has stayed connected to his alma mater, the University of Chicago College of Pharmacy, for 61 years; teaching classes, supporting events, and serving as an adjunct professor. Additionally, Ted taught continuing education courses on merchandising and retailing for licensed pharmacists at night at the college. Through the years, Ted got to know several deans. A conversation that he had with Dean Jerry Bauman back in 2015 about the work his company had done while remodeling some pharmacies rang a bell. He had mentioned to Dean Bauman the treasures he had found in the storage rooms of those pharmacies as they were being redesigned.

Jerry stopped Ted and asked, “Would you mind helping me out with a mess?” Curious, Ted followed Jerry to the pharmacy building attic where he took a look around. The room was filled with old desks, chairs, AV equipment and boxes upon boxes of donated items from closed pharmacies. Thousands of items! Jerry explained that many of the boxes were from widows of alumni. When their husbands passed, they weren’t sure what to do with the antique equipment and unused medicines. So, they donated them to their alma mater. And, the boxes stacked up.

Jerry thought the artifacts could be saved and displayed around the pharmacy building. Ted knew he needed help and thought his great niece, Kim Byrne (a professional photographer with an artistic eye), may be the perfect person to help sort the collection and decide which treasures should be kept for display. Together, Ted and Kim worked for more than two years, sorting the contents of the boxes into three piles: things to keep for display, things to throw away, and chemicals and hazardous compounds that needed to be disposed of through special handling.


Two years after Ted and his niece began sorting the boxes, the new dean, Glen Schumock, saw a need for a conference room and gathering space for alumni. Dean

Schumock hoped to repurpose a large space on the first floor of the College of Pharmacy for a new Alumni Room and museum. Ted was immediately on board and provided a grant and donated the creative talent to design and fixture the space. Although he had retired from Gladson Interactive, several of Ted’s former draftsmen and interior designers were happy to help with the design of the new Alumni Room. Ted quickly enlisted the help of Kim again to oversee the museum project end-to-end.


The new Alumni Room ribbon cutting and dedication was held on June 12, 2019. ■



Cooper's Patent Pill Machine




Standing almost 24 inches tall, this apothecary show globe was probably used as a window display.


The Importance of Planograms

Ted Gladson (Chi, '59) founded the store design and merchandising company Gladson Interactive in 1971 and served as the company's president until his retirement in 2005. Gladson Interactive (now Syndigo) is a firm dedicated to providing best practice consulting on store design, merchandising, market research, and product databases.

In the late 1960s, Brother Ted Gladson was pursuing a successful career as a pharmaceutical rep when he was given a challenge to improve the sales of a popular cough medicine that was normally kept behind the pharmacy counter, even though it was an over the counter (OTC) product. Crippled with no budget for advertising, Ted got creative. He convinced a store owner to let him put the product out on the shelf, but the owner was skeptical. There was no room on the crowded shelves, because at that time, store shelves were stocked haphazardly, with no concept of why products should be placed on a certain shelf or area. One of the popular stocking methods of that time was to simply arrange items alphabetically. After studying the shelves, Ted had a plan. He took off his jacket, grabbed a rag and some cleaning solution, rolled up his sleeves and went to work cleaning and reorganizing the shelves. The pharmacy manager was amazed at the result. The shelves were so open and orderly that he had to count all the products to make sure Ted hadn't discarded some! Cough syrup sales went way up and the idea of using planograms as a means of bringing intentional order and focus to the shelving of products was born.

Brother Gladson went a step further and applied scientific marketing data to the arrangement of OTC products. With bar code scanning not even on the horizon, product movement data was hard to come by. The only companies with reliable figures were major chains that shared sales data with Information Resources Inc. and AC Nielsen. These actuaries focused on compiling data collected through retail store audits.

Having access to the data for the cough and cold category enabled Ted to develop a picture



In retail, products need to be situated at the edge of a shelf with labels outward toward the customer, a method known as facing. Planograms demonstrate the number of facings and location for each product on a shelf. This is determined by a product's sales. When planograms are used to optimize product placement, sales increase and inventory is balanced.

planogram that others could replicate, armed only with a Polaroid Land Camera for photos of products and item schematics on a white board and a grease pencil. The first planogram was developed using those photos and an item schematic on a white board.

More art than science early on, this approach eventually led to the software-enabled retailing of today, in which every square inch of frontal shelf space exposure has been considered scientifically for maximum sales impact and inventory turnover. Ted's analytically based organization system enabled retailers to strategically plan product placement so customers can find what they are looking for quickly and items that are frequent-

ly bought on impulse are within sight. Statistics say that 7 percent of customers leave a store empty-handed because they couldn't find their desired product. Planograms show what shelf a product should be placed on and how many facings for each item. The best-selling products are allocated the largest amount of prime eye-level shelf space, the area from which the majority of sales occur, due to their better visibility.

In addition to helping customers find items, planograms also help place products in relationship to customers' buying behavior, so a well-organized store will sell more products. The best planograms also make restocking and inventory processes easier and faster.

Brothers Make an Impact

The start-up

When *THE MASK* staff asked Brother Gladson where and how Gladson Interactive was started, he chuckled, “Well, in the living room of my house.” He knew products could sell better if they followed a data-driven marketing plan and he saw it work in the test stores he set up for that first cough and cold medicine line. Working part-time as a pharmacist, he dedicated the rest of the next six months to writing a business plan. He set up free merchandising seminars around the state of Illinois, explaining the value of merchandising and tweaked his business plan using the feedback from those seminars. In September 1971, backed by the endorsement of a drug wholesaler, Ted launched his new business.

Independent pharmacies in the 1970s that were using Ted’s planograms saw an increase in sales. Soon, wholesalers saw the success and they, too, began implementing planograms.

In the early 1980s, Ted met Bob and Phyllis Cohen, and it was a marriage of opportunity. They needed databases to operate their software and Gladson needed their software to apply his databases. The Cohens pioneered planogram software in 1980 with a product they called “Spaceman.” With that software, Gladson Interactive developed the first ever nationwide product database spanning product package images and dimensions in 1985. The databases grew to include food, drug and mass merchandise. Today, that database includes approximately 1.5 million images, with a 21 percent change rate annually. Package dimensions are measured to a 100th of an inch and all package wording is placed in a searchable database for extraction by need (e.g., active and inactive ingredients, calories, sugar, salt, etc.).

Gladson Interactive became the leader in new and existing store design and merchandising, employing marketing experts, store designers, and software developers. By the time Ted sold the company in 2005, Gladson Interactive had remodeled more than 5,000 stores nationally and internationally.

Today’s category merchandising approach involves strategies such as placing best-selling products in the most prominent places on the shelf, in the 5’-0” to 5’-5” height range, and allocating the most shelf space to these products. Since 43 percent of total sales are impulse and eye-level visibility is a major factor in driving impulse purchases, store layouts are designed to stock the impulse items on the perimeter or high traffic aisle with the planned purchase items to inner aisles and back of the store. The status of which products get prime position is constantly monitored by periodic review of sales data. ■










