





As we continue to reflect on our recently completed Grand Council Convention with a message of how we are making an impact, I'm delighted to announce that Kappa Psi brothers have been recognized by the Professional Fraternity Association for their efforts.

Dr. Lawrence “LB” Brown is the recipient of the 2019 Career Achievement Award that honors a distinguished member for participating actively on a regular or continuing basis in the Fraternity. Dr. Brown was nominated based on his organizational leadership (Grand Regent 2007–2009, APhA President 2015), volunteer efforts with Kappa Psi and his awards, presentations, and publications in both academia and clinical practice.

Dr. Mandy Irvin is the recipient of the Outstanding Volunteer of the Year Award which honors an individual for exceptional service or extraordinary commitment to the Fraternity or community. Dr. Irvin was nominated for her work with establishing the T.E.A.L. Walk at Delta Omega. This walk remembers victims and honors survivors of ovarian cancer. Since 2014 where the first walk raised \$1,800, it has grown exponentially with the sixth walk coming up this September. Dr. Irvin remains involved as a representative and is recognized by T.E.A.L. as the founder of T.E.A.L. Savannah.

JrCOSTEP

Zeta Chi brother is selected for the Junior Commissioned Officer Extern Program with the U.S. Public Health Service, working at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center (PIMC) in Phoenix, Arizona.

Through navigation of the detailed application process, to being tentatively selected, to progressing past the medical and background checks, to the excitement of receiving notification of my site assignment, to achieving ultimate satisfaction when my duty orders arrived, and knowing that all the preparation and diligent work were successful, my JrCOSTEP journey was an adventure.

I was selected to serve as a Commissioned Corps Junior Officer through the Junior Commissioned Officer Extern Program with the U.S. Public Health Service. My assigned location was highly desired indeed, as I was selected to work at the largest Indian Health Services facility in the nation, Phoenix Indian Medical Center (PIMC). Located in downtown Phoenix, Arizona, PIMC is a large complex consisting of a 127-bed hospital, urgent care, and ambulatory care service unit in a major metropolitan area. Although there are more than 20 registered Native American tribes in Arizona, American Natives and Alaskan Indians travel from all over the nation to utilize PIMC as their community pharmacy for primary medical care and for other specialized needs. Currently, there are six separate pharmacies operating on the PIMC campus, including two in-patient pharmacies, primary care, pediatric, and specialty care pharmacies. The main pharmacy is utilized by the majority of the patients as their local community pharmacy and

processes approximately 400 prescription refills every day.

Upon my arrival, I was asked what areas I was specifically interested in while spending my summer at PIMC. "Everything!" was my reply, and my preceptors went above and beyond to tailor my experiences accordingly. I had the opportunity to witness remarkable practices such as intravitreal injections by an ophthalmologist, to watch a trans-tympanic injection by an otolaryngologist, to assist with a Unna boot wound-care dressing while shadowing a very experienced nurse during outpatient wound clinic, and to witness a rare diagnosis of bullous pemphigoid during dermatology clinic. Another significant inclusion was a COSTEP exchange with the students assigned to the Whiteriver Service unit! My weeklong excursion was packed with adventure and encompassed community engagement, immunization administration, medication requisition, home visits for high risk infants, and shadowing pharmacists in the emergency department, while in-patient, and during pharmacist-run clinics.

I am amazed at how well the pharmacy staff integrated into the ambulatory patient care teams. With four specialty clinics (Rheumatology, Oncology, HIV and Hepatitis C) as well as six pharmacist-run clinics (Tobacco Cessation, Cardiovascular Risk Reduction, Anticoagulation, Latent Tuberculosis, Contraception Care, and Immunizations), pharmacy plays a big part in patient care at PIMC. I had the fortune to participate in all the pharmacist-run clinics, to work in each of the different pharmacy locations, and was afforded many additional unique opportunities. To name a few, I performed bedside medication requisition for a newly admitted hospital patient, I compounded nifedipine lubricant, I counseled patients on medications for colonoscopy preparation, and I dispensed medications in the emergency department to discharging patients by

shadowing an overnight emergency department pharmacist.

Opportunities to expand my learning and assist the staff were plentiful. Pharmacy improvement projects I completed incorporate creation of a United States Pharmacopeia (USP) 795-compliant compounding record for 1:1:1 mouthwash, compiling data for a research project following use of empagliflozin, preparing drug information sheets for Pharmacy and Therapeutics review, and performing a gap analysis for USP 800 compliance updates. I traveled to an off-site clinic on the Yavapai Apache reservation and completed inventory in their pharmacy and assisted pharmacists in the pharmacy-run clinics.

I was able to enhance my public speaking skills by presenting a patient case-related S.O.A.P. note, by leading a journal club on a recent diabetic trial, and by giving a topic presentation on cystic fibrosis. [Thank you, Dr. Phan!]

Some of the greatest knowledge I have accrued over the many weeks at PIMC came

directly from speaking with the other pharmacists about their experiences working with Indian Health Services and the Federal Bureau of Prisons. I knew before I arrived that I was highly interested in a career in the ambulatory care setting following graduation. Not only has this experience reinforced my goal to follow patients in a clinic-based setting, it has also solidified my desire to serve the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and to seek a SrCOSTEP to progress toward this ambition.

I knew that my time at PIMC would be challenging and educational, yet the phenomenal staff made the expedition extraordinary, priceless, and full of warm memories. I will cherish my PIMC JrCOSTEP journey for many years and am extremely grateful to all those who made an impact on my future.

P.S. I have been tentatively selected to serve as a SrCOSTEP!



The inaugural class is 200 students out of 500 completed and 1,000+ incomplete applications. She is the only student from St. Louis in the program.

Lauren plans to use the degree to better her knowledge of medical cannabis so she can eventually be a clinical director of a dispensary. She would also like to continue to teach and help pharmacy schools bring medical cannabis into their curriculum. She plans to start with a lecture at STLCOF this March. Lauren says, "The opioid epidemic and need for alternative pain therapies is really what pushed me into the program. Since I didn't do a residency, I was trying to find my niche—what I was passionate about, and over the last year, I really realized it was pain management."


Dr. Campbell's story began with his initiation into Kappa Psi on May 4, 1954. Upon graduation from URI in 1957, Dr. Campbell began his journey of positively influencing everyone around him. His thirst for knowledge did not end with URI, as he went on to earn his MBA, J.D., and Ph.D. Dr. Campbell's extensive education crafted him into a well-rounded individual, providing him the ability to tackle the issues pharmacists across the world faced every day. As a rising figure in the pharmacy community, Dr. Campbell was elected to numerous executive positions within countless organizations. As an author of more than 100 publications in professional and education journals, Dr. Campbell con-

tributed his knowledge and wisdom to better the world of pharmacy.

Within Kappa Psi, Dr. Campbell's extensive history and contributions to the Fraternity continue to this day. In 1972, Dr. Campbell was elected Grand Regent, tasked with overseeing the Fraternity nationally. One of his proudest accomplishments was the creation of the Kappa Psi Foundation, assisting with the education expenses of collegiate brothers across the Fraternity. Each year, Beta Epsilon is privileged to have Dr. Campbell meet with the new brothers of our chapter. Dr. Campbell passes along his wisdom and experiences to the new brothers and provides ample time to answer any questions the new brothers pose. Additionally, Dr. Campbell makes sure they know the legend of him being initiated on 5-4-54. Our time learning from Dr. Campbell is invaluable and leaves a lasting impression on every new brother of Beta Epsilon. Our new brothers leave with a vision of leading the future of pharmacy while striving to represent the values of Kappa Psi to their fullest.



With all of the significant contributions from Dr. Campbell throughout his years, there was no better way to honor him than as one of the inaugural inductees into the URI College of Pharmacy Hall of Fame. The ceremony was a small tribute to the man who has dedicated his life to the betterment of his university, his profession and his Fraternity. The night was full of stories from the past and excitement of what the future of pharmacy will hold. More than 300 brothers from across the Province and the country were in attendance for the assembly and the centennial red and white gala! We are so proud to be celebrating 100 years of Beta Psi and look

Celebrating 100 Years!

Beta Psi was installed at the University of Wisconsin-Madison on December 6, 1919, with 12 charter members. In 1925, when Kappa Psi split into Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity and Theta Kappa Psi Medical Fraternity, 32 of the existing chapters were medical student chapters, 27 were pharmacy student chapters, and 5 were combination medical and pharmacy student chapters. Beta Psi was one of the five combination chapters, and when it was separated, the pharmacy group retained the chapter name of Beta Psi, and the Theta Kappa Psi chapter was named Gamma Delta.

Beta Psi has transitioned through many Provinces due to Province realignments, including the Middle West Province (1925–38), Province IX (1938–46), VI (1946–89), V (1989–2012), and finally to the Northern Plains Province of today. There have been around 10 different Beta Psi chapter houses over the years, starting with the first in 1920. The longest inhabited house was at 615 North Lake Street from 1963–2007, located on campus near the shore of Lake Mendota and close to the campus social hubs of the Memorial Student Union and State Street. When the School of Pharmacy relocated to the other side of campus, a new chapter house was purchased in 2008, housing five Beta Psi brothers and serving as the location for chapter meetings and social events.

Beta Psi became inactive in 1935 and was reactivated in 1939, motivated and guided by School of Pharmacy Dean Arthur Uhl. Brother Uhl was awarded The Order of the Golden Mortar honoring his 50 years in Kappa Psi in 1970. Beta Psi has affiliation with six Grand Officers including Norm Campbell, Ralph Clark, John Schwarz, Richard Strommen, Dale Wurster and Mike Steffens. Grand Ritualist and UW faculty Brother Wurster was instrumental in the reactivation of Beta Psi in 1946 after its dormancy during WWII, in which 106 Beta Psi brothers served. On June 17, 1949, the Wisconsin Graduate chapter was chartered and continues to support the Beta Psi brothers through ownership of the Beta Psi chapter house and mentorship of pledges and brothers. Past Grand Officer (too many offices to name), Kappa Psi legend Brother Norm Campbell attended UW-Madison in 1959 for his MBA and became an active participant in the Beta Psi chapter. He returned again in 1969 for his Ph.D. and was present to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Beta Psi.

Beta Psi became coed in 1977 when three female brothers joined the chapter. In 1994, Beta Psi commemorated their 75th anniversary with many Grand Officers, Beta Psi actives and graduates celebrating together, including a rousing game of softball at a park overlooking picturesque Lake Monona. Beta Psi has been honored with several Kappa Psi awards, including Most Improved Chapter in 1995, rank of No. 10 chapter in 1997, and No. 8 chapter in 2015. Beta Psi has produced three Kappa Psi Foundation Scholarship winners and multiple GCD achievement awards.

On December 6, 2019, Beta Psi chapter of the University of Wisconsin-Madison will finally reach an incredible milestone to be celebrating 100 years as a chapter of Kappa Psi. This last


