
The excitement of in-person meetings

Rise to the 60th Grand Council Convention

The 60th Grand Council Convention of Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. was held July 17–21, 2022, in Phoenix, Arizona. This was the second Grand Council Convention hosted in the “Grand Canyon State” and the last since the Centennial Celebration of the 39th GCC in Scottsdale, Arizona. Brothers gathered at the Arizona Grand Resort & Spa, the host hotel, and the chairperson of the convention was Dr. Jason Milton. In attendance were 497 brothers and guests who had registered for the five-day convention (253 collegiate brothers, 208 graduate brothers, 36 guests).

The 60th Grand Council Convention opened with unparalleled enthusiasm and excitement after having been delayed nearly a year due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. As brothers were welcomed into General Session I by Grand Regent Christy Askew, the Golden Bow opening ceremony was performed by Grand Ritualist Joe Nardolillo. In addition to her opening remarks, Grand Regent Askew, Grand Vice Regent Jason Milton, and Executive Director Johnny Porter welcomed the Brotherhood and their guests to the 60th Grand Council Convention. Brothers were then introduced to the candidates for the 2022–2024 International Executive Committee who offered their respective candidate speeches, imparting their visions and goals for the Fraternity over the next two years.

Although the brothers were looking forward to a beautiful night under the stars for the opening reception, Mother Nature offered other plans and the reception was shifted into the beautiful Sonoran Sky Ballroom. Here, brothers and their guests gathered to rekindle old friendships and welcomed those members who were also new to the GCC experience, as this was the first opening reception in three years and many collegiate brothers were experiencing their first GCC.

On Monday morning, breakfast was served to both guests and family members of brothers. Grand Regent Askew and Grand Vice Regent Milton also hosted a Province Supervisor Breakfast where insights and reflections of the past term were shared. Shortly after, brothers were able to enjoy the first of four continuing education programs. Dr. Jordan Calloway, husband of Brother LaNae Calloway (Orlando Grad, Epsilon Zeta initiate), presented on “Continuing Education Program I: Mental Health & Wellness for Pharmacists.” General Session II followed with officer reports, standing committee reports, and the Memorial Exercise was performed. Of note, during his report, Executive Director Johnny Porter informed the members of the convention that he would be retiring from his role. Since his initiation in 1971, Brother Porter has served the Fraternity for 50 years and his impact to our organization was captured with a

well-deserved standing ovation from the Grand Council following his remarks, a theme that would continue throughout the week.

The afternoon was highlighted by our keynote speaker, Brother W.T. Smith (St. Louis Grad, Gamma Pi initiate). Grand Vice Regent Milton introduced Brother Smith and his extensive background to both the Fraternity as well as the pharmacy profession. Brother Smith was gracious in his



remarks to share his inspirational journey and offer wisdom and guidance around how he was able to “Rise to the Challenge” throughout the course of his life. After finishing his remarks, Grand Vice Regent Milton presented Brother Smith with a token of appreciation. Shortly after the keynote, the “Meet the Candidates” forum was held. This was the second iteration of this session in which the candidates were all available for interviews during a scheduled time to allow brothers and delegates to discuss the candidates’ plans for the future of the Fraternity.

The Kappa Psi Foundation also held their first board meeting to round out the afternoon.

The evening featured a new format for awards programming. The first Collegiate & Graduate Awards program & Graduate Benefactor Reception was held in the beautifully spacious Canyon Ballroom. Brothers and chapters were recognized for their service and hard work through the 2021–2022 year. Additionally, Brothers Chris Miller and Craig Runyan were the newest members inducted into Society 1879. The ceremony concluded with Brothers Deanna McDanel (Delta Zeta) and Julie Akers (Beta Pi) receiving their Robert A. Magarian Order of the Silver Mortar for their 25 years of membership as well as Brothers Paul Knecht (Louisiana Grad, Gamma Mu initiate) and Executive Director Porter being awarded the Preston W. Eldridge, Jr. Order of the Golden Mortar for their 50 years of membership in Kappa Psi.

Tuesday morning began with an in-depth overview of “Thanatology: Facing Death in Practice.” This continuing education session was hosted by Immediate Past Grand Regent Robert Mancini. Following this event, General Session III began with highlights from International Committee reports. One key highlight was from the Philanthropy Committee. Brother Kelsey Johnson presented their report which highlighted the Fraternity’s support for our national philanthropy partner, Reach Out and Read. Despite the challenges the pandemic presented, brothers and their supporters raised over an additional \$50,000 to make Kappa Psi a six-figure donation partner. Committee chairs Kelsey Johnson (Chi) and Ting Ting Fu (Idaho Grad, Epsilon Pi initiate) were later recognized by Grand Regent Askew with W. Bruce Philip Certificates of Commendation during the awards reception later that evening. Wrapping up the morning was the introduction of the legislative proposals chaired by Grand Counselor Buchanan and the Legislative Committee.

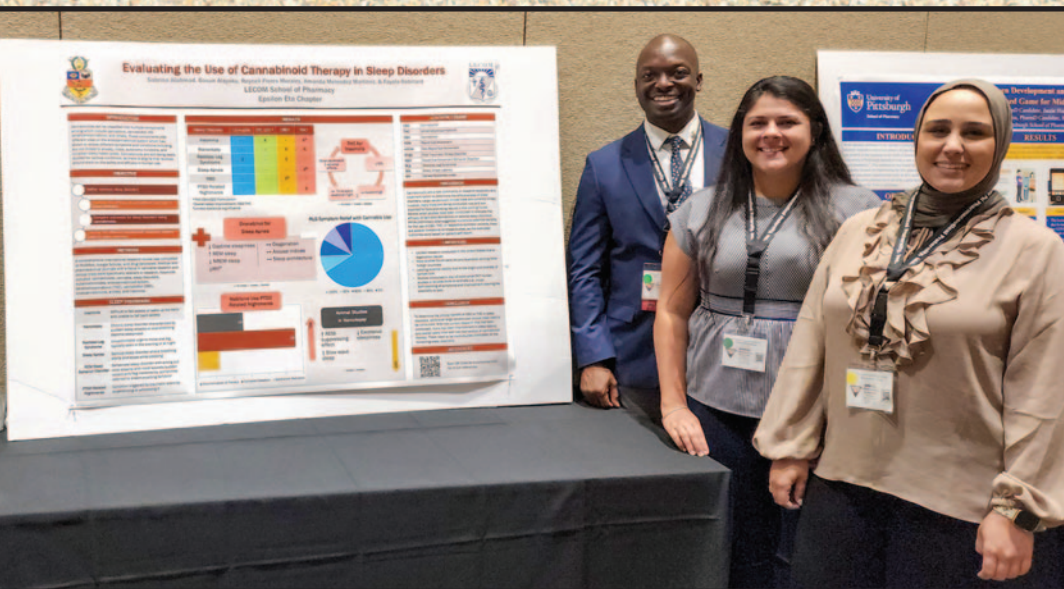
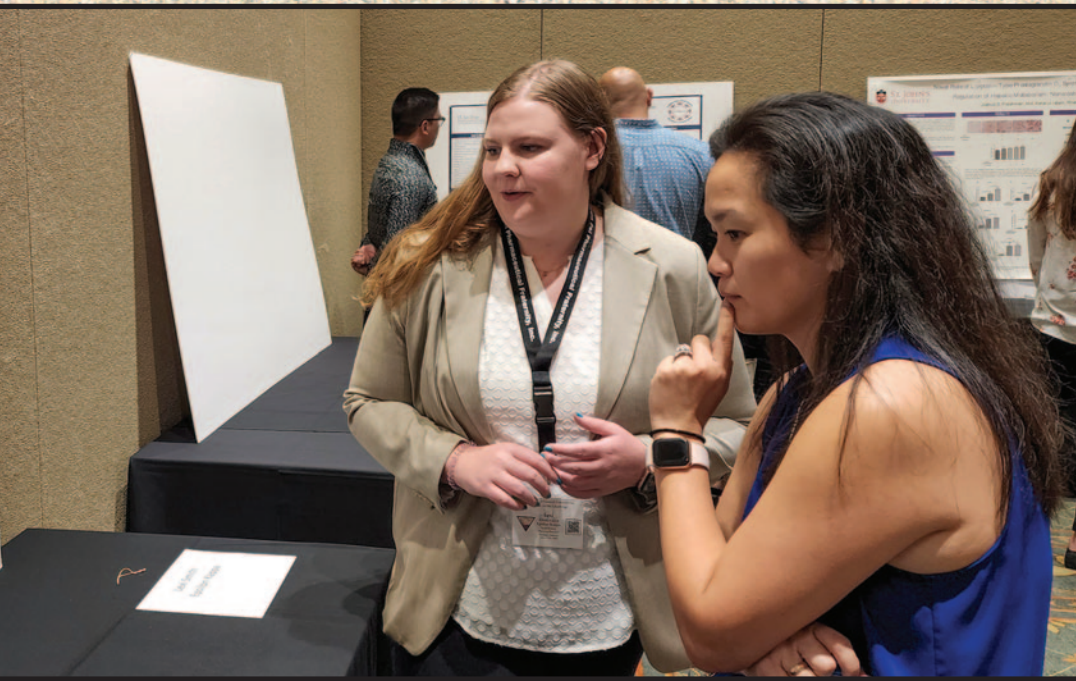
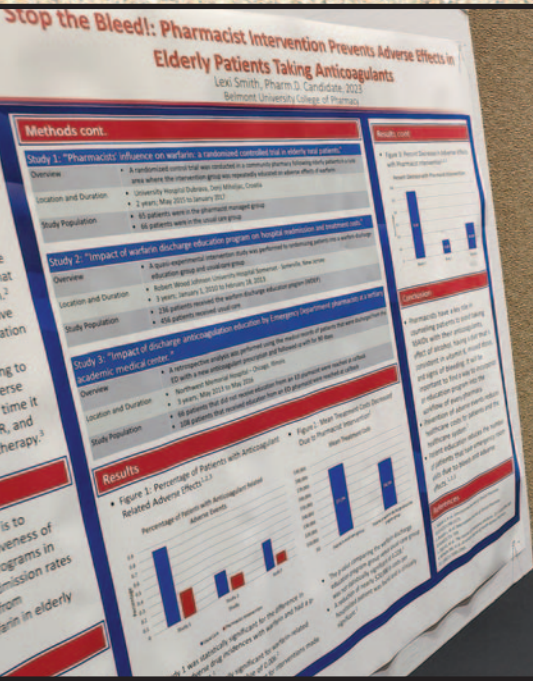


Additionally, an announcement was made about the fourth Kappa Psi Leadership Symposium, to be held next summer in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, June 28–July 1. Following General Session III, the Advisory Committee held a working lunch and the Grand Council Deputies held their biannual luncheon with an open forum discussing their collegiate chapters. The afternoon was filled with an opportunity to learn from our International Executive Committee members as they hosted their officer forums. Two sessions were held so brothers had the opportunity to attend a variety of programming.

One of the highlights of a busy Tuesday was the student poster presentations and career roundtables. This was the second GCC that this particular event was held, and students presented posters on multiple topics including clinical research and Kappa Psi involvement. Brothers were recognized for their posters in a variety of categories. Concurrently, attendees of the career roundtable event were able to learn from over 20 areas of pharmacy that our graduate brothers practice in and career and professional advice was provided throughout the event. The evening concluded with brothers enjoying some fellowship at an exciting mixed entertainment venue called The Main Event hosted by the Arizona Graduate chapter.

Wednesday morning began with an exciting CE topic on “Imposter Syndrome” hosted by Brother Amanda Winslow (Savannah Grad, Delta Omega initiate). General Session IV began shortly after with the focus of the session on the Legislative Hearing. After much discussion on the proposals involved, the session was closed and our attention turned toward a very useful session offered by one of our sponsors, Premier Income Partners. The focus of their afternoon in-service was highlighting financial responsibility and the opportunities to become fiscally responsible early in our professional careers. Collegiate members then received financial reimbursements to wrap up the first part of the day. The afternoon was then filled with Province caucuses being held across the resort.

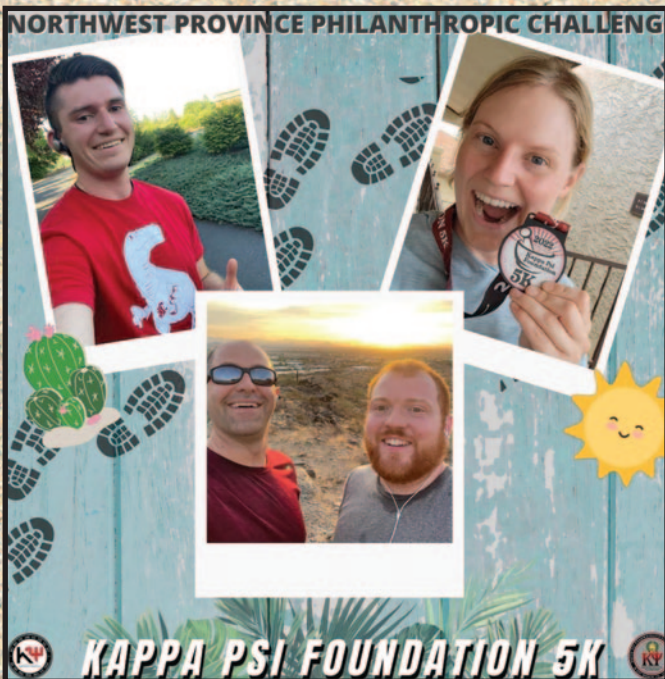


The evening was filled with chapter sales where numerous Provinces and chapters offered a variety of Kappa Psi merchandise available for purchase. Alongside this event, the Kappa Psi Foundation also hosted its Poker Tournament. Helping to administrate and organize the event were Brother James Wall (Pacific Grad, Gamma Nu initiate) who was supported by Joseph Wong (Pacific Grad, Gamma Nu initiate); Theresa Lin (Pomona Grad, Epsilon Gamma initiate); Stephanie Forsythe (Kansas City Grad, Beta Kappa initiate) who also was the final table dealer for the fourth GCC in a row; Sunny Bains (Pacific Grad, Gamma Nu); and Derrick Egi (Pacific Grad, Gamma Nu). Winners and a summary of the events can be found below. Returning for a second consecutive GCC was the dessert reception or ice cream sundae social. This event was a tremendous success as sprinkles and ice cream dotted the ball-room tables.

The final day of events was kicked off with a CE session from Brother Patrick Hryshko (Arizona Grad, Gamma Upsilon initiate) who presented on “Longitudinal Anticoagulation Management in an Ambulatory Care Setting.” Following his excellent CE presentation, the brothers gathered for General Session V. Of note, a very special series of moments were experienced by all as Executive Director Johnny Porter went through his last roll call and each of the delegates in attendance offered a simple “thank you” in their own way. Provinces were on display in the morning as they shared their reports summarizing activities of their respective chapters over the last three years. The last of the legislative sessions was completed, followed by new business. Promptly afterward, the resolutions report was presented by Brother Jessica Reno (Cleveland Grad, Zeta Epsilon initiate) of the Resolutions Committee.

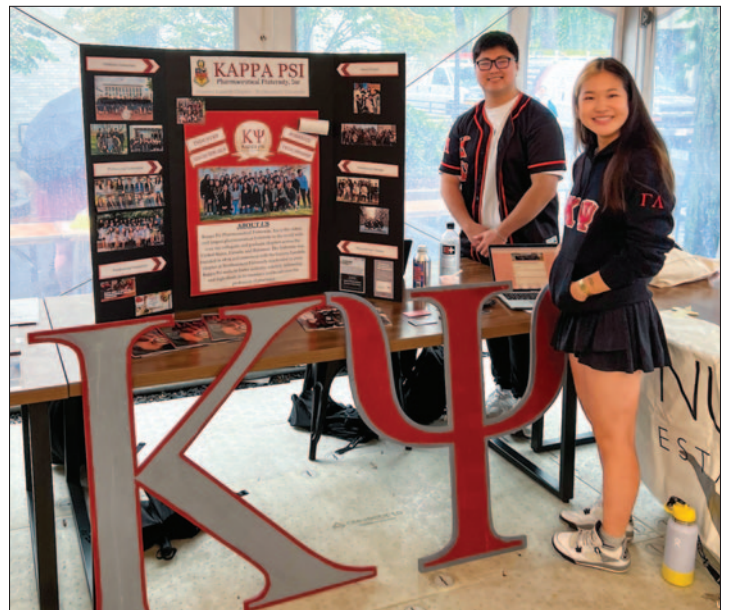

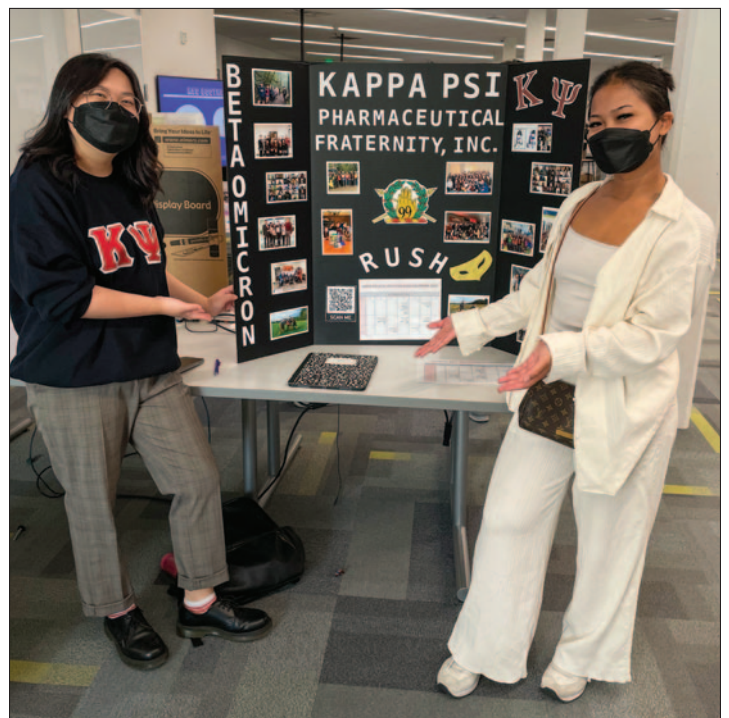

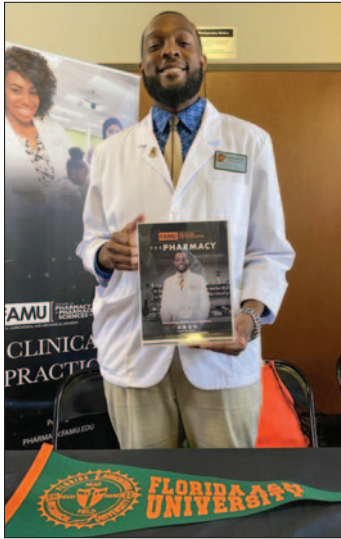
