# Spin the Wheel

On the inside of Brother Cesar Redaja's left arm is tattooed a lyric from the song "How Far I'll Go," which is sung in his favorite Disney movie, "Moana." It reads **"If I go there's just no telling how far I'll go."** In the movie, Moana is torn between staying safely at home or venturing into the unknown to try to save her dying island. The lyric resonates with Cesar. If he finds himself complacent, hesitant, or worried that he'll fail, he reminds himself "You'll never really know how far you'll go." As a result, Brother Redaja's life has been full of opportunities, triumphs, and joys that have come from overcoming his fear and venturing into uncharted waters.

### **The Wheel**

Zeta Delta chartering Brother Cesar Redaja grew up watching *Jeopardy!*, *Wheel of Fortune*, and *Survivor* with his family. The competition would get pretty intense as everyone gathered around the television and raced to see who could solve the puzzles faster. (Mom often won!) Those family nights are treasured childhood memories.

Other favorite childhood memories that Cesar has were from family trips to Disney. He loved it when his family visited from the

Philippines and everyone went to Disney World together. He has such happy memories of family time there with his cousins and admits he is a true Disney fanatic.

Cesar found his partner, Chris, shares those two greatest loves: Disney and solving puzzles. The two of them have done more than 150 escape rooms. They both share a love for everything Disney and were engaged in Disneyland California, married in Disney World Florida, and honeymooned at Disneyland Paris. When the pandemic hap-

pened in 2020 and everything shut down, there were no new episodes of *Wheel of Fortune* being taped. The network ran rerun episodes. Cesar and Chris enjoyed watching the marathon of *Wheel of Fortune* reruns and Chris commented, "You should get on this show. Just apply. You are really good at it!"

When Cesar looked into the audition process, he noticed that *Wheel of Fortune* was looking for Disney fans. It seemed like a sign! So, he dressed in his best Disney clothes and made a one-minute video telling why he'd

make a great contestant. Cesar laughed and admitted it was very corny, but he tried to show his personality and energy. He threw confetti in the air. It was enthusiastic, filled with subtle Disney quotes and references, and without professional edits.

An estimated one million people audition for the *Wheel of Fortune* each year and only 600 make the cut, so Cesar figured his audition video went to the trash can when he hadn't heard back in a few months. The rest of 2021 passed and then all of 2022 became history as well. In February of 2023, he got a call from Burbank, California, on his cell phone while he was at work. He figured it was spam and ignored the call.

He later saw he had a message from Sony Pictures. He still figured it was a spam call until he listened to the message. The message was from Felicia and she wanted to let him know that the *Wheel of Fortune* casting department really enjoyed the video that he had submitted for audition and wanted to do a phone interview. Audition? It had been almost two years since he had submitted that video and at first it didn't sink in.

And, then it did! He immediately told his co-workers he had to take his 15-minute break and he stepped outside to call Felicia back. He said his heart was racing and he kept having to recompose himself to keep from talking too fast.

Felicia spoke with him for about 10 minutes and she sent a Zoom link for him to interview with the contestant producers at the *Wheel of Fortune*. When he logged in for the interview, he found other contestants being interviewed with him. After about 10 minutes of talking, he was asked to wait in a private Zoom room. The casting producers came back on to talk some more. Unsure of what they were looking for, Cesar just tried his best to stay enthusiastic. The producers ended the Zoom call, thanking him for his time and letting him know that some contestants are not chosen for up to 18 months after their interview. He was thrilled to have actually had an interview but honestly didn't want to get his hopes up. The odds are 600 in 1 million to be selected for the show.

Nine days later, just one week before Cesar and Chris were headed for a much-anticipated vacation in Germany, Cesar checked his email and found a message from Sony Pictures. They invited him to a March 21 taping date, which landed right in

the middle of his upcoming vacation. It wasn't a hard decision to choose which direction to go. He had a 0.06% chance of being selected for the *Wheel of Fortune* and a 100% chance of going to Germany at another time. They canceled the trip to Germany and he headed to California!

Cesar landed in LA and headed to Sony Pictures Studios in Culver City, California, about 20 minutes north of Los Angeles. He was told the filming would take a whole day and to arrive by 7 a.m. The studio tapes six or seven episodes a day. The morning was spent going over logistics and legalities. There was paperwork to sign and the contestants met with lawyers who explained the contracts. They were given tips on how to behave on the set . . . what to say, how to maintain a smile, when to clap, and how to avoid clapping into the mic. They practiced getting excited and practiced how to spin the wheel, which weighs a surprising 2,400 pounds!

The contestants practiced calling out letters and did some trial games before the filming started at noon. Episode after episode was filmed and the contestants alternated between playing the game and being in the audience. The studio also filmed a short clip called "Hometown Howdy," which is a TV commercial specifically made for the contestants' hometown to air on local networks. Cesar filmed a small commercial specifically for Tampa Bay.

Cesar was given an air date of May 18, 2023, for his episode (Season 40, episode 7799). He was under contract to keep all details of the filming secret until the shows were aired. It killed him to keep the excitement in! Ironically, the taping was at the same time that Disney was celebrating their 100th anniversary, so he used that as an excuse for why he was in California. While there, he and Chris took in Disneyland and went on a cruise. His friends may have been a bit suspicious, though, because he had been spending an hour a day for six months learning German in preparation for the Germany trip and instead, he was in LA.

### Going for it

When asked how the day went, Cesar said it was very surreal how it all unfolded. He solved the first of two Toss-Up puzzles which earned him \$1,000. Then in Rounds 1 and 2, the contestant to his right solved both rounds without giving him a turn.

In Round 3 of the *Wheel of Fortune*, there's one wedge that is called the "Express Wedge." If a contestant lands on that wedge, they have the option of "hopping on the Express," but they cannot back out. Once on, they must keep calling letters until they either successfully complete the puzzle or they call an incorrect letter and bankrupt. They can win \$1,000 for each correct answer, but if they guess wrong, they lose it all. Chris had told Cesar that morning, "I had a vision that you went first on the prize puzzle round, landed on the Express Wedge, and got every letter right." Cesar laughed. The chance of that was almost impossible! But, in the third round, he was the first contestant to go and spun the wheel and landed on the Express Wedge (one of 24 wedges). He could decline or go for it. He went for it. Since he was the first contestant to go, he had no clues to work with . . . only blank squares, the law of averages, and luck. He had a 1/21 chance of calling the right consonant. He went for it, called every correct letter from start to finish, and earned \$12,000 plus a \$13,398 16-day/15-night trip to Portugal and Spain. His puzzle was "VISITING GORGEOUS WINERIES."

He said it was more difficult to think on stage than it is in one's own living room. There's so much going on. The live audience is cheering constantly and there's a bustle of activity on stage, just outside of what one sees on TV. Cameramen and the producers are moving around just outside the line of view of the unused letterboard and the timer. A few times, he would call obvious letters just to utilize the 5–10 seconds that it took for Vanna White to walk to the board in order to collect his thoughts and refocus. Cesar ended up winning a total of \$26,398.

As the contestant with the highest score, Cesar moved on to the bonus round. Only 200 of 600 contestants who end up on the *Wheel of Fortune* make it to the bonus round. *THE MASK* staff asked Cesar, "When one does a Google search online about Cesar Redaja and the *Wheel of Fortune*, there seems to be quite the controversy about you being "robbed" of \$100,000 in the bonus round. Can you tell us about that?" Fans were in an uproar because they felt the phrase Cesar was given to solve (THAT WAS A PIVOTAL FACTOR) was too obscure. Cesar laughed. He said it was flattering that so many people jumped to his defense, but he felt the game was completely fair and didn't understand the

controversy. He said it was an amazing experience and he said the staff at Sony Studios treated him and Chris like royalty.

He actually didn't know there was a controversy until the day after his episode aired. He was having lunch with Chris and his mother-in-law when someone recognized him and said they saw him on Fox News. He looked at his phone and saw friends had tagged him in links to several news outlets. The Tampa paper ran a headline story about him and larger news sources like *Newsweek*, *Fox News*, *New York Post*, and *HuffPost* picked up on the supposed controversy of the final phrase and those comments and discussions were top-trending for a week. He laughed and said it was a slow news week.

Cesar pointed out that the photo that appeared in the news articles of him with his mouth gaping open was not taken when he saw the final phrase. Instead, it was from when Pat Sajak revealed the prize envelope. There are 24 prize envelopes with an unknown amount in each. It's not revealed what's inside until after the bonus round is over. The minimum amount is \$40,000 and



almost all of the envelopes are for \$40,000. There's only one \$100,000 envelope and that was the one Cesar had! He had always been good at solving phrase puzzles and the contestants get to choose one of three categories in the bonus round. He had already decided if one of the category choices was a phrase, he'd take it. And phrase came up as one of his choices. He had joked with Chris earlier about putting in a pool if he won \$100,000 and there was the \$100,000! His jaw dropped at the coincidence and that was the photo that appeared in social media and on the news outlets.

## Venturing into the unknown

Cesar's *Wheel of Fortune* adventure was not the first time he had stepped out in faith into the unknown. After graduating from the University of South Florida with a degree in chemistry, Cesar was still unsure of what he wanted to do in life. He was drawn to health care. His father had undergone major surgery and Cesar watched the interdisciplinary team take great care of him. He marveled at their expertise and thought, "I want to be one of them!" He considered medical school, but he was very interested in and

excelled at chemistry. Pharmacy seemed to be a better match.

But, when Cesar applied to pharmacy school, he realized his undergrad coursework was missing a couple of biology requirements. He didn't give up. He met with an academic advisor at the University of South Florida School of Pharmacy and she suggested he take the courses he needed post-bachelor and then apply. In 2012, he was accepted into the University of South Florida College of Pharmacy.

## Starting a Kappa Psi chapter

Cesar was involved in Alpha Phi Omega service fraternity while pursuing his undergrad degree at USF. He met so many interesting people through that group and enjoyed the camaraderie. He loved working side by side on service projects. He began Google searching and discovered there were several pharmacy fraternities. But, there was no pharmacy fraternity on campus at USF. His search brought him to the Kappa Psi website and he was very interested in how their mission seemed to fit him. He shared his interest in finding a fraternity with his friend, Alex Yassein, and Alex mentioned, "Hey, I have a friend who is interested in a pharmacy fraternity. I'm going to meet with him to study. Why don't you join us?"

So, Cesar met to study with Dom Nguyen and Phuong Lam. Dom was excited. He had done research and had also found Kappa Psi. Dom knew some students in the class above who had also expressed an interest in a pharmacy fraternity. As they spoke with other students, they discovered there was a big interest from others to start a chapter too. They decided to go for it!

Dom reached out to Kappa Psi and learned that starting a chapter would take quite a bit of work. But, they were all in. 19 students including Cesar connected with local alumni brothers who were very receptive and who were willing to help. Marvin Smith came to campus to help with initial setup and logistics. By late 2012, a colony was established on the University of South Florida campus. Dom served as the pro tem regent and Cesar was the pro tem vice regent. On March 15, 2014, Zeta Delta was officially chartered as a chapter of Kappa Psi. Cesar said it was such a sense of accomplishment, but it wasn't easy. The fledgling chapter had no one who had ever been through pledging and ritual and

they had no 'footsteps to follow' for chapter operations. Brothers from Epsilon Eta chapter and other Southeast Province brothers stepped up to mentor and help with the pledging process and brothers from every SEP chapter and several of the Executive Committee members flew down to join Zeta Delta for initiation.

Cesar went on to serve as Zeta Delta regent and then SEP assistant newsletter editor, then Historian, Vice Satrap, Satrap and then eventually past Satrap. He served as co-GCD for Zeta Delta from 2016–2019. He stays involved with the Kappa Psi Brotherhood through Tampa Graduate chapter and has served as Tampa Grad regent.

## Stepping out in faith again

Cesar had excellent grades throughout pharmacy school and was poised for success. He had interned at Publix and had excelled there. When the pharmacy department made him a wonderful offer to join their team, he was torn between pursuing a residency or accepting the job offer from Publix. He chose

the latter since he already excelled at that job and it was a great offer. He was good at customer service, he enjoyed helping people, and he was good at the business side of running a pharmacy. However, he reflected back to his original goal, which was to handle acute cases in a more clinical setting. He thought back to his dad in the hospital and the joint work of the interdisciplinary team. That was his original goal.

He began researching and submitting applications for other positions. But, he was concerned he had limited his options by not pursuing a residency. For nearly a year, he applied for positions, but would almost immediately get a rejection. He simply did not have the residency experience that many were looking for. In 2018, he applied for a clinical pharmacy position at the HCA Florida South Tampa Hospital and about a month later, he was granted an interview. When Cesar arrived for the interview, he was surprised to discover several Kappa Psi brothers he had met during pledging were pharmacists at the hospital, including Alan Cole and Matt Antonopoulos. He was excited to see familiar faces and it made him want the job more than ever, as he knew the character and hard work ethic of his future colleagues.

## 'How Far I'll Go'

*THE MASK* staff asked Cesar where he plans to go next. He laughed and said he and Chris would finally take that Germany vacation in February 2024. Right now, he's putting in all the extra research he can to be the best possible at his job as a clinical pharmacist at the HCA Florida South Tampa Hospital. Cesar mentioned there's also been a first-ever fan-favorite episode of *Wheel of Fortune* where 15 previous contestants were invited back to compete. Who knows, maybe we'll see Cesar again? ■

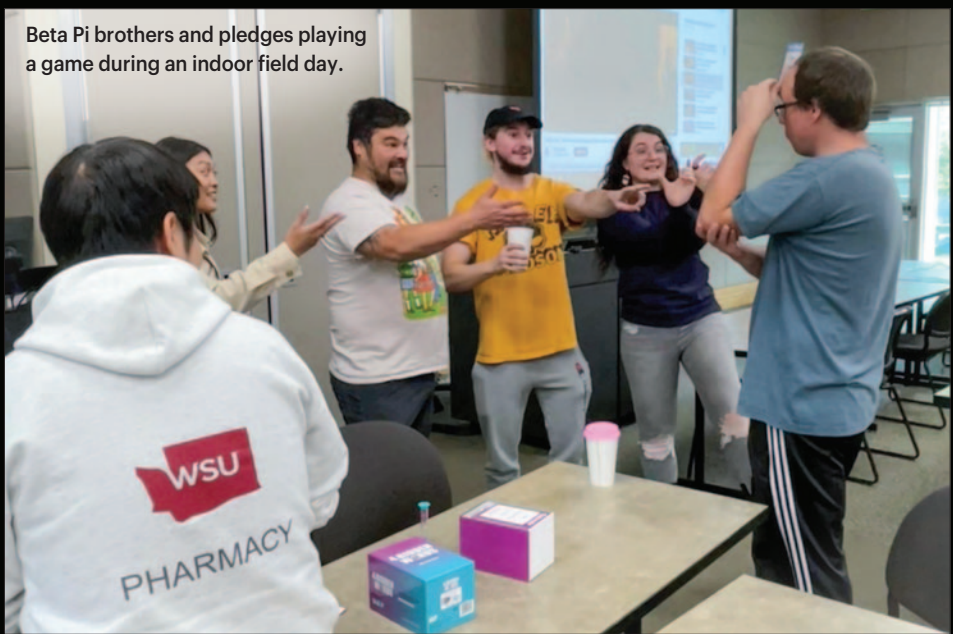

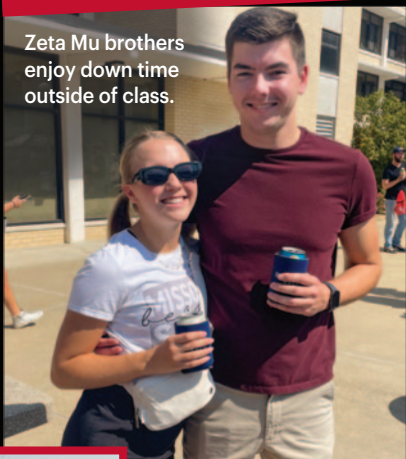

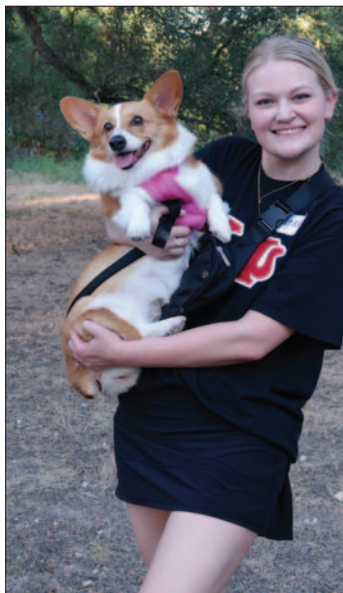

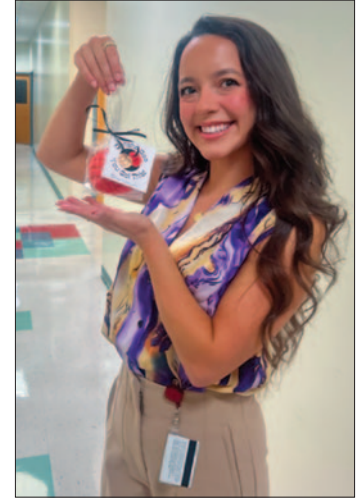
