Kappa Psi Archives: a treasure of fraternal records

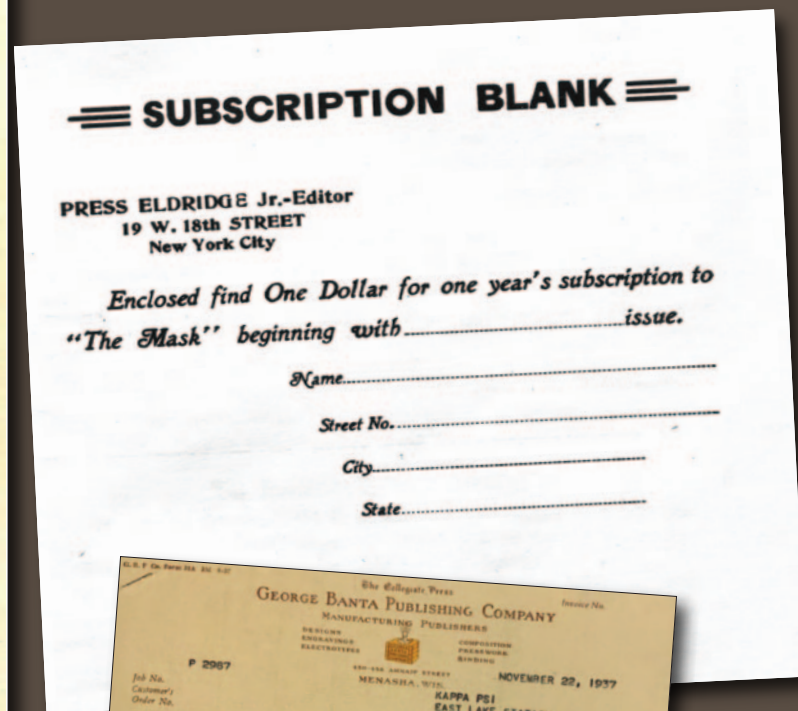

In 2018, the decision was made to archive the physical collection of *The MASKs* into a searchable online archive. Issues were scanned and archived in PDF form. Sprinkled with bits of humor, these back issues are available for brothers to read or download from the Fraternity archive site (kappapsiarchives.org). Subscription sign-up in the first edition of *THE MASK*

\$1 in 1904 is equivalent in purchasing power to about \$33.61 today, an increase of \$32.61 over 119 years. The dollar had an average inflation rate of 3% per year between 1904 and today, producing a cumulative price increase of 3,261.46%.

Today, *THE MASK* is published quarterly, both in print and digitally. Brothers subscribe by paying their alumni dues.

Initially, *THE MASK* was published monthly. In 1906, we started printing four times per year, with the exception of 1922, 1923, 1970, and 1971 where only three issues were printed. When reading through chapter reports 120 years ago, it is interesting to note many of the problems being addressed in 1904 are the same issues being addressed by our chapters today!

Kappa Psi Brother Aids in Cuban Prisoner Exchange

The American Pharmaceutical Association, at the request of the American National Red Cross is aiding in the Cuban prisoner exchange program.

Brother James D. Hawkins (Xi-Ohio State) of APhA staff and his wife (also a pharmacist) left on January 3 to join the American National Red Cross team at Havana, Cuba to evaluate and confirm the inventory of the pharmaceuticals that have already been shipped in exchange for the Cuban invasion prisoners and to assist in making determination of the remainder of the shipments to be made.

At the same time the American Pharmaceutical Association is offering technical assistance to the American National Red Cross in Washington in classifying and evaluating pharmaceutical needs for the completion of the prisoner exchange agreement. This cooperative program is expected to continue for some time.

APhA Executive Director William S. Apple (Beta Psi-Wisconsin) commented that "We are pleased to be able to be of assistance to the American National Red Cross in this extremely important and challenging assignment."

Brother James D. Hawkins is a graduate of Ohio State University, joined APhA staff in September, 1962 and serves as assistant director of the membership division. Mrs. Hawkins is also a graduate of Ohio State University (June 1962).

In the April 1949 issue of *THE MASK*, in Frank Eby's letter, he wrote: "Within a few weeks, many brothers will be graduating and leaving the chapter of which they have been so important a part. Certainly the chapter's losses will be pharmacy's gain. These men constitute a selected group and will do much to strengthen our profession in all of its phases. In addition, they can, and we feel sure that they will, continue to support Kappa Psi in the same fine way that they have in the past. Brothers, join the graduate chapter nearest to you, keep your collegiate chapter and *The MASK* informed of your whereabouts, and visit your collegiate brothers and your school as often as possible. Congratulations and good luck to all of you."

THE MASK continues to record not only the activities of the local chapters but also the events of the day that affect the field of pharmacy.

The 1949 April *MASK* held reports on the reactivation of Xi chapter at Ohio State and a letter "From the Desk of the Grand Secretary-Treasurer Ray S. Kelley. Ray wrote:

"The word 'AWAY' should precede the word 'FROM' in this page title. Herein lies the reason for such a statement as the "New England Wanderer" of March 1948 wanders again in 1949." Brother Kelley proceeds to write in depth of his March chapter visits. Those visits included the March 24 installation of the St. Louis Graduate chapter. Brother Kelley got up early to drive from Oklahoma City to St. Louis and noted: "March 24. St. Louis at 8:00 a.m. Not too early for a hearty greeting from the brothers of Gamma Pi. After breakfast, a privately conducted tour of St. Louis (kindness of Brother Speckart)."

The program noted the Kappa Psi brothers' many initiatives serving communities in Detroit, including educating the public about COVID-19 at the start of the pandemic, promoting childhood literacy through our Reach Out and Read philanthropy, addressing food insecurity through various out-

FROM THE ARCHIVES

RECRUITMENT PARTIES AND SOCIAL GATHERINGS CHANGE

Smokers were often held in the early 1900s and recruitment parties called 'smokers' were recorded even in the 1990 magazines.

In the ENTERTAINMENTS department of the January 1913 edition, Eta chapter reports:

ETA's SMOKER—On Monday evening November 4, 1912, we held our annual smoker in the "Grotto" at Mossbacks ... There were about 65 present, including the visitors and active and passive members. ... The fore part of the evening was spent in playing Progressive Euchre. ... We were then served with the most delicious delicacies of the season. The balance of the evening was spent in speech making, begun by Professor Loebeck, who gave us an interesting talk on his college life and the good of fraternities.

The chapter report from Beta Psi in the April 1953 edition reported:

... "It seemed everyone saw red at our Valentine's day party held February 14. In spite of the vivid imagination of our social chairman, Lowell Luedke, which resulted in the colorful red beer a good time was had by all. We have a St. Patrick's day party coming up and unless I miss my guess completely the beer will emerge a brilliant green.

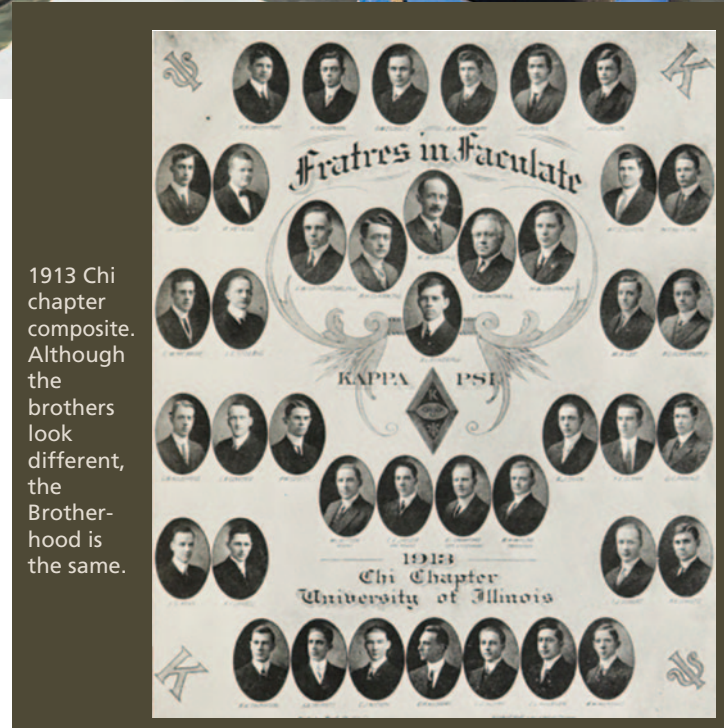

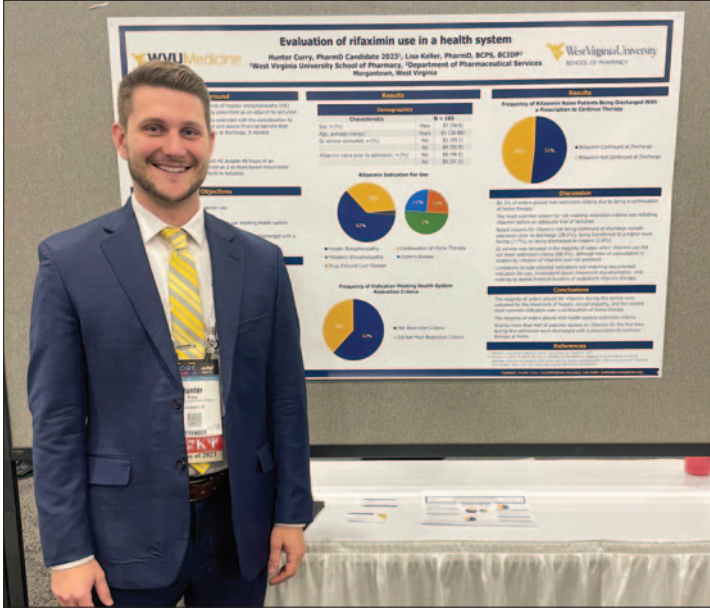

The April 1933 MASK, pg. 25, had this obit/tribute:

VIRGIL COBLENTZ, Ph.M., A.M., Ph.D., M.D., Gamma

Dr. Virgil Coblentz, retired professor of chemistry at the College of Pharmacy, Columbia University, died in the West Philadelphia station of the Pennsylvania Railroad . . . on June 7, 1932, a few hours after attending the fiftieth reunion of his class at the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy. Waiting for a train to return to his home at Long Branch, N.J., Dr. Coblentz suffered a coronary thrombosis and died in the arms of a classmate, Joseph Richards, of New York.

Dr. Coblentz . . . graduated from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy when only 20 years old, with the degree of Graduate in Pharmacy and Master of Pharmacy. For the next three years he was professor of materia medica and toxicology at the Cincinnati College of Pharmacy. From 1886 until 1891 he studied at the Universities of Göttingen, Strassburg, Munich, Würzburg and Berlin, under Herman Ludwig Ferdinand von Helmboltz . . . and other foremost scientists of Europe.

From 1891 until 1911 Dr. Coblentz was professor of chemistry at the College of Pharmacy at Columbia. For the next six years, he was chief chemist for E. R. Squibb & Sons. He had been pathologist at Hazard Hospital, Long Branch, since 1920. Dr. Coblentz held the degree of Doctor of Medicine from Berlin, but never practiced. He had conducted vast research in medical and pharmaceutical chemistry. Dr. Coblentz was the author of *A Handbook of Pharmacy, The Newer Remedies, and Volumetric Analysis*. He was formerly a member of the Chemist's Club of New York.

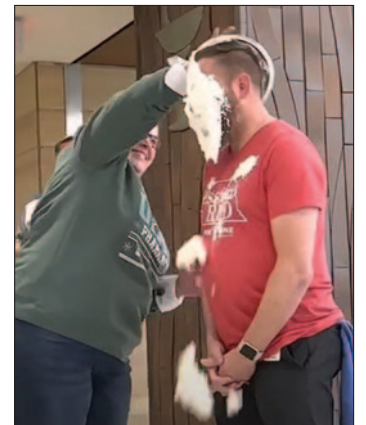

Portland Graduate Brother F. M. Curry was the city chemist of Portland in 1922. In the April 1922 *MASK* (pg. 67), he wrote a report on a fellow Beta Zeta initiate, E.C. Calloway:

PORTLAND’S MILK INSPECTION

To Kappa Psi goes the honor for bringing about a condition that Portland has just pride in, a supply of pure milk.

The city was one of the pioneers in the fight to have city control of milk supplies in the sense of sanitation. This was brought about by the consistent effort of two members of the fraternity and is being carried on by one proud to call all men of Kappa brothers.

In 1911 Brother E. C. Calloway, a graduate of Beta Zeta and an active member of the fraternity, accepted the position of city chemist. His chief duty, besides being in charge of the municipal laboratory, was to inspect the dairy herds about the city for both tubercular and sanitary conditions. At first he had to go into the field himself and collect samples of the milk and then perform both the chemical and bacterial tests.

With but two assistants the task was a strenuous one. However, through the co-operation of a large daily paper, the *Oregon Daily Journal*, public opinion was aroused to the seriousness of the situation and the city staff increased.

Dr. E. A. Pernot, also a Kappa Psi, was appointed as city bacteriologist in 1914 and another medical man appointed as chief medical inspector. This left Calloway free to elaborate on his milk analysis ... From one of the worst cities in the United States Portland came to the front and in ... 1919 the city made the highest score at the National Livestock Exposition in Chicago.

In five years, the number of infant deaths dropped from 32.6 to 3.6 per 1,000.

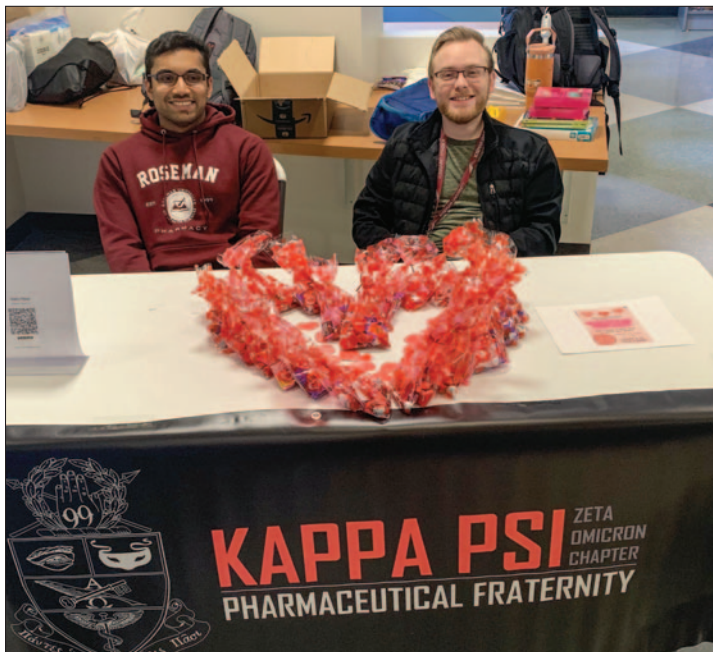

THE MASK REFLECTS THE TIMES

The editorial found in the April 1943 *MASK* gives us insight into the depth of the war effort.

“World War II and its effect on Pharmacy and students of Pharmacy is of prime importance to readers of *THE MASK*. We have therefore asked three members of the profession, an educator, a director of research, and a retail pharmacist to discuss the effect of the war on their particular phase of the profession. . . . The war has also caused us to change somewhat the form of *THE MASK*. To conserve metal and paper it will be bound with a single saddle-stitch, and printed on 60 lb. stock. It is hoped that this voluntary conservation of materials will aid in the war effort and allow us to continue publication of *THE MASK*.”

In the April 1953 edition of *THE MASK*, a report was given on the progress of the fight against polio.

POLIO FACTS FOR 1953

“Tremendous recent progress toward a control for infantile paralysis has brought us to the threshold of prevention of the disease. Thanks to the support of the March of Dimes by the American people, scientists are now planning the first field trials of a polio vaccine, and manufacturers are producing the blood fraction, gamma globulin, for limited use as a temporary preventative of paralysis. . . . Hope rides high.

The article ended with “Conquest of polio is not yet here—but final victory is much nearer.”

The April 1955 edition of *THE MASK* had a chapter report from Gamma (Columbia University).

CHAPTER LETTERS

“Greetings once again from Gamma. Since the last newsletter, most of our time has been consumed by our Smoker and subsequent pledge period. . . . As was expected, the Smoker was thoroughly enjoyed by members and pledges alike. We were all treated to a very interesting and enlightening talk on cancer, by Dr. Dedisch, the head of the Cancer Research Department of Memorial Hospital, New York. Following the talk, Dr. Dedisch answered many questions which helped to clear up some of our haziness regarding this disease, especially on the subject of the smoking-cancer relationship.

The January 1968 edition of *THE MASK* found Beta Zeta (Oregon State) brothers lending their hands for a blood drive.

CHAPTER “NEWSLETTERS”

“The first major project of the year was the fall blood drive in which the brothers give major assistance in the setting up, operation, and dismantling of the total operation. The collection was held November 14, 15 and 16. All previous records were surpassed as 1,240 pints of blood were collected for statewide use and in Viet Nam [sic]. The brothers of Beta Zeta are proud to be able to assist in this worthwhile effort which is growing in size each year.”
