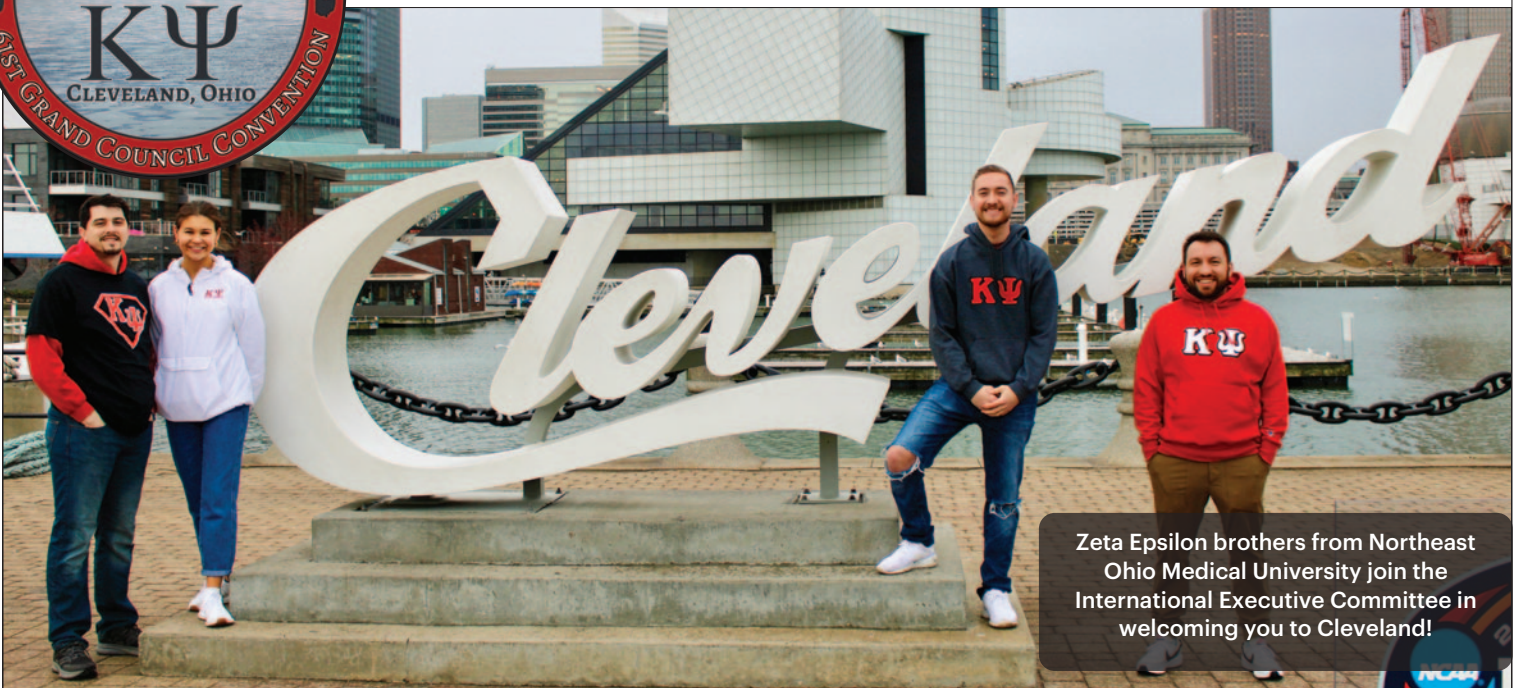

61st Grand Council Convention FAQs

GENERAL QUESTIONS

How do I register?

Registration is available on the Kappa Psi website at www.kappapsi.org/gcc-61

Early registration rates are available until May 15. Regular registration rates apply May 16–June 25. Registration will close on June 25.

Hotel reservation information is also available on the Kappa Psi website. <https://kappapsi.org/gcc-61>

Cutoff date for hotel reservations under the group block is July 8. Group rates are available starting Saturday, July 20, through Wednesday, July 31 (Note: These dates are the default arrival/departure dates on the reservation website. You will need to change to accommodate your arrival/departure date).

What is included in the price of registration?

Member registration includes: the opening reception with heavy appetizers (enough for a meal) Wednesday, awards buffet dinner Thursday, ice cream social Friday, Alpha Chapter reception and Anniversary Banquet Dinner Saturday, morning coffee, collectible GCC pin and coin, continuing education sessions, all general business sessions, workshops, and admission to the exclusive Kappa Psi event at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Guest registration includes: the opening reception with heavy appetizers (enough for a meal) Wednesday, guest welcome breakfast Thursday, awards buffet dinner Thursday, ice cream social Friday, Alpha Chapter reception and Anniversary Banquet Dinner Saturday, collectible GCC pin and coin, and admission to the exclusive Kappa Psi event at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

This is my first Convention; what should I expect?

Wednesday: This day kicks off GCC! It is the best day to pick up your registration items: lanyard, name tag, GCC pin, and coin. You will need your name tag to attend the exclusive Kappa Psi event at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in addition to attending all GCC meetings and events. The first continuing education (CE) session is scheduled to occur late afternoon. Then, General Session I begins with opening remarks, the GCC keynote address, and the candidates for International office give their speeches. After General Session I will be the Opening Reception where brothers have the opportunity to meet each other and network while enjoying food. The evening concludes with an exclusive event held at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Thursday: Thursday will be the first full day of GCC! If you have not already picked up your registration items, you will want to do so in the morning. The second CE session will occur before the business meeting. A session for collegiate chapter delegates will occur while CE is going on. This session will allow delegates and first-time colle-

giate attendees the opportunity to learn expectations while representing their chapter at the business sessions. At General Session II, place cards will indicate where chapter delegates should sit. To access any of the committee or officer reports, visit the convention page at www.kappapsi.org. Grand Council Deputies will have the ability to network and share chapter experiences at an invite-only luncheon. The rest of the day will fly by with workshops and the Meet the Candidates session. The awards dinner, recognizing chapters and individuals, will occur at night.

Friday: Registration will again be open in the morning with the CE session occurring prior to General Session III. Province Supervisors will meet for an invite-only breakfast. General Session III occurs in the morning followed by time for brothers to get lunch. Time has been reserved in the afternoon for Province caucuses. In the evening, students can participate in the Poster Presentation session followed by networking and learning from graduate brothers during the popular Career Roundtable session. The Ice Cream Social and Chapters Sales will also occur this evening.

Saturday: CE Session IV and General Session IV will occur in the morning followed by a short break for lunch on your own. General Session V will occur in the afternoon but may be canceled if all business and elections are completed during General Session IV. Make sure your chapter delegate is present in the morning. The Alpha Chapter will host a reception before the Anniversary Banquet where officer installations and recognitions will occur with the Closing Ceremony of GCC.

What do I wear?

Wednesday: Casual

Thursday during the day: Business casual attire (examples: dress, skirt, slacks, blazer, collared shirt, sandals, flats, heels, dress shoes) It is recommended to have a cardigan or jacket on hand, as the meeting rooms can get cold.

What is the Chapter Sales event? How do we participate?

The Chapter Sales event occurs Friday evening. Participating chapters will be assigned a table and have the opportunity to sell items and swag to fellow Convention attendees. In the past, chapters have sold Kappa Psi apparel, jewelry, stickers, mugs, artwork, and much more! Sign-up information will be coming soon.

DELEGATE QUESTIONS

How do chapters submit delegate forms?

Forms can be completed in the Portal (preferred method). Paper copies can also be found at kappapsi.org. Only 1 submission per chapter is accepted.

How do chapters submit proxy forms?

Forms can be completed in the Portal (preferred method). Paper copies can also be found at kappapsi.org. Only 1 submission per chapter is accepted.

How much money is reimbursed for the chapter delegate?

Each chapter will receive a travel stipend for one delegate to attend. This stipend is for roundtrip air transportation determined by The Central Office. The amount due to each collegiate chapter for the 61st Grand Council Convention can be found in The Portal under Central Office Documents. The delegate must attend each General Session (Thursday–Saturday) to be eligible to receive the stipend.

I don't know what being a delegate means?

No worries! You are not alone. Most chapter delegates are first-time Convention attendees. As a delegate, you represent your chapter during the Convention business sessions, which includes voting on behalf of your chapter. During the meetings, you will sit at a designated seat labeled with your chapter name. Most questions can be answered at the Delegate Meeting on Wednesday before General Session I, but you can also ask brothers during the meeting if you have any questions on the process for Robert's Rules. When in doubt, ask! Many other brothers may have the same question as you.

Will I be able to meet the officer candidates?

Yes. There will be a Meet the Candidates session on Thursday afternoon. Information regarding this session will be sent in the future.

My chapter is only sending one delegate. Is that a problem?

No. One delegate from a chapter is still entitled to cast both (2) of the chapter's votes.

HOTEL QUESTIONS

What is the best way to get to the hotel from the airport?

Uber and Lyft are both available from the airport to the Convention hotel. Estimated price is anywhere from \$25–\$35, depending on the time of day. Light rail is also available to and from the airport costing \$2.50 per trip. Estimated time to and from the airport via light rail is 35 minutes.

I am planning to drive to GCC. Is hotel parking available?

Onsite, self-parking is available at the contracted rate of \$20 per day with valet parking priced at \$48 per day.

When is the last date to book a hotel room?

The final date to secure accommodations at the contracted rate is Monday, July 8, 2024. The hotel will no longer be able to guarantee the contracted group rate after the block release date.

What if I am the only one coming from my chapter?

We are so glad to have you! Many brothers come to GCC solo. It is a great place to make friends and connections. Looking for a roommate? Checking with other chapters within your Province is a great first step if you are looking to split hotel costs.

What is within walking distance from the hotel?

This year, our Convention hotel is centrally located in downtown Cleveland near many attractions and restaurants! Almost everything is walkable from the hotel, and there are tons of options to explore all that Cleveland has to offer.

GUEST ATTENDEE QUESTIONS

What events can a guest attend?

Guests attending the Grand Council Convention can attend the opening session Wednesday evening before the reception, the opening reception, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame event, guest breakfast, selection workshop/development sessions, awards and benefactor dinner, student poster sessions, career roundtables, chapter sales, the ice cream social, The Foundation poker tournament, the Alpha Chapter reception, and the final banquet.

What can guests do during closed events?

The Cleveland Guardians, an MLB Team, has a home game on Thursday, July 25, at 1:10 p.m. (tickets not provided). Chris Miller

Chris Miller was initiated in 2004 into Beta Kappa chapter at the Univ. of Pittsburgh. Upon earning his PharmD in 2008, Chris entered into community pharmacy practice where he worked as a community pharmacist, district leader, and advanced to his current position as Director of Pharmacy Compliance, Quality and Preparedness.



As a collegiate brother, Chris served as the Beta Kappa treasurer for two terms and also on the 52nd Grand Council Convention host chapter planning committee. Additional chapter responsibilities included chairing a Province assembly planning committee and also the Beta Kappa House Committee. Chris' involvement on the Province level included holding the office of Treasurer, Satrap, and 53rd GCC Delegate. Nationally, Chris served on the Collegiate Development Committee. He was the recipient of the 2008 Beta Kappa scholarship award and the 2008 Province II Paul Hiller Brother of the Year Award.

As a graduate, Chris continued to actively participate within the Province by serving as Satrap both in Province II and then in Mountain East Province. Chris received the Province II Graduate Brother of the Year Award in 2010. He was also a charter member and regent of Laurel Highlands Graduate chapter. Chris has served on various international committees including the Graduate Chapter Awards Committee, Grand Council Deputy and Graduate Development committees. In 2009, Chris received the Grand Council Deputy Certificate of Excellence, and in 2014 he received the Grand Council Deputy Outstanding Achievement Award. From 2013–2015, he served as the Province Supervisor for the Southeast Province. Chris served as the Coordinator of Province Affairs from 2015–2017, Beta Kappa chapter Grand Council Deputy from 2008 to 2017,

Graduate Member-at-Large on the International Executive Committee from 2017–2019, and Grand Historian from 2019–2022. Currently, Chris serves on the International Executive Committee as Grand Vice Regent and is the chairperson for the 61st Grand Council Convention. In addition, he continues to remain active in the Pittsburgh Graduate chapter by holding various offices.

Outside of Kappa Psi, Chris is a member of various pharmacy organizations and the University of Pittsburgh School of Pharmacy Alumni Society where he served as president during 2015–2016 and is the current secretary of the Pennsylvania Association of Chain Drug Stores.

Joe Nardolillo

Joe Nardolillo is a 2012 initiate of Beta Epsilon chapter at the University of Rhode Island. He earned his Doctor of Pharmacy in 2018 and completed residencies with the Indian Health Service and the University of Colorado. He's currently a clinical assistant professor at University of Rhode Island with a focus in ambulatory care and health equity.



Kappa Psi is a cornerstone of Joe's professional and leadership development. As a collegiate, he served as Beta Epsilon rush chair, chaplain, graduate liaison, and regent. Within Northeast Province, he served as Satrap from 2016–2017. In 2017, Joe was elected as Collegiate Member-at-Large and elevated collegiate perspectives on the International Executive Committee. As Grand Ritualist from 2019–2022, he guided chapters through pandemic-related restrictions to execute rituals. As Grand Counselor, Joe currently supports brothers through crucial matters related to legislation, policy, risk management, and taxes.

Joe served on multiple chapter, Province, and international committees. On the international level, he participated in the 57th GCC Resolutions Committee, served and later co-chaired the Collegiate Development Committee (2015–2017, 2017–2019), chaired the Pledge Program Committee (2019–2022), and currently chairs the Legislative and Policy Committees.

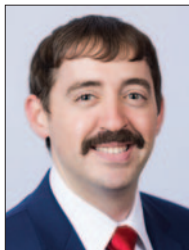

Kelsey Johnson

Kelsey E. Johnson is a 2010 Chi chapter initiate from the University of Illinois at Chicago. Upon graduation, Kelsey worked as a community staff pharmacist and pharmacy manager as well as an inpatient overnight clinical pharmacist. 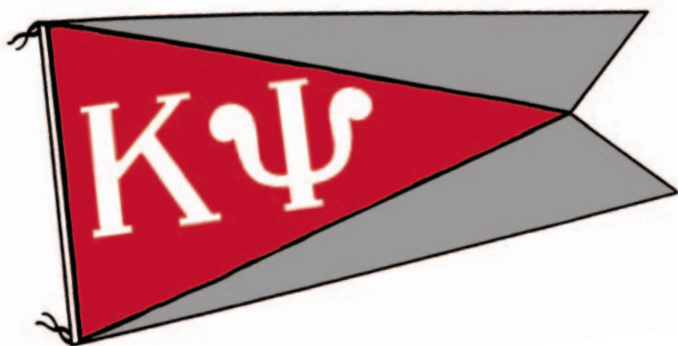
